

Barque Pembroke

Monday Dec 30<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced pleasant with light winds from the N.W. at daylight called all hands and made sail steering S.W. and at 12 noon spoke a right whale and at 1 P.M. spoke another also at 4 P.M. spoke a third but no oil

Tuesday Dec 31<sup>st</sup>

This day commenced pleasant with light breezes from the S.W. steering S.W. with all sail set at 10 A.M. saw a right whale lowered and struck him and got the oil

Wednesday Dec 1<sup>st</sup>

This day commenced pleasant with light breezes from the N.W. at daylight made sail steering S.W. at 8 A.M. saw two right whales lowered the boats but could not strike them at night took in sail

Thursday Dec 2<sup>nd</sup>

This day commenced pleasant with a calm all day at 8 A.M. saw several humpbacks carried over all night

Friday Dec 3<sup>rd</sup>

This day commenced pleasant with light breezes from the N.W. steering S.W. with all sail set saw several right whales but could not get near them also several fin & humpbacks at night took in sail

Barque Pembroke

Monday Dec 5<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced pleasant with light breeze from the N.W. at daylight made sail steering S.W. at 5 P.M. saw a great number of humpbacks saw one ship to the windward at night took in sail

Tuesday Dec 6<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced pleasant with light breezes from the S.W. in the morning made sail steering N.W. in the afternoon the wind died away a calm saw several humpbacks at night took in sail

Wednesday Dec 7<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced pleasant with light breezes from the N.W. at daylight made sail steering on the wing at 3 P.M. saw one right whale 4 miles off run for him at half past 3 lowered the boats and struck him and killed him and brought him along side and commenced cutting the ends

Thursday Dec 8<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced pleasant with light breeze from the N.W. at daylight called all hands and finished putting in the whale and made sail and started the tryworks at 3 P.M. saw one right whale lowered the boats but could not strike him saw one ship to the leeward

Friday Dec 9<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced pleasant with light breeze from the N.W. at daylight made sail steering on the wing at 5 P.M. by the boiling at night took in sail
