Saturday Dec 10th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the N.W. at daylight made sail steering E.S.E. broke out the main hatch and stowed down the oil saw two right whales lowered but could not get within haul of them saw one ship astern got no observation

Sunday Dec 11th

This day commences pleasant with fresh breezes from the W. at day light made sail steering E.S.E. saw the iron steamship Phoenix of London also spoke the ship Bagard of Greenport Capt Fordam 19 or 20 months out saw several finbacks at night took in

Latt 35 45 S Long 6 14 W

Monday Dec 12th

This day commences pleasant with fresh breezes from the N.W. at day light made sail steering E.S.E. parted company with the Bagard saw nothing scarred sail all night this morn

Latt 35 50 S Long 1, 56 E

Tuesday Dec 13th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the S.E. steering on the wind to the E with all sail set saw nothing this morn

Wednesday Dec 14th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the N.W. steering S.W. with all sail set saw several finbacks this morn

Thursday Dec 15th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the N.W. steering S.W. with all sail set saw several finbacks got no observation

Friday Dec 16th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the N.W. steering S.W. with all sail set at 10 A.M. it blew off saw one right whale lowered but could not get near, shot him

Latt 36, 58 S Long 7, 00 E

Saturday Dec 17th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the N.W. steering S.W. with all sail set at 9 A.M. saw two whales going very quick lowered but could not get near them at 11 saw one whale lowered and got close on to him and he settled in the afternoon saw several finbacks

Latt 37, 00 S Long 8, 15 E

Sunday Dec 18th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the N.W. steering S.W. with all sail set in the P.M. afternoon the wind hauled to S.W. steering S.E. by E saw one finback this morn

Latt 37, 43 S Long 9, 44 3/4 E

Monday Dec 19th

This day commences pleasant with light breeze from the E.S.E. steering on the wind with all sail set at 2 P.M. saw one whale lowered and struck him and killed him and brought him along side and commenced cutting

Latt 38, 00 S Long 10, 00 E this morn
