This day commences with thick fog and heavy breeze from the N.W. in the morning it cleared off and we made sail steering on the wind to the W. spoke the Barque Cassius J. H. Capt. Jennings 14 months out 1800 W. spoke the Georgia J. H. Capt. Hull 18 months out 1700 W. at night took in sail set no observation

Thursday Jan 12th

This day commences pleasant with light breeze from the N.W. at day light made sail steering S. by E. in company with the Georgia at 10 A.M. went on board of her in the afternoon spoke the S. F. Capt. Claridge 12 months out one whale also saw several other ships saw no whales at night took in sail Lat 42, 30 Long 48, 18

Friday Jan 13th

This day commences pleasant with strong breezes from the N.W. laying too under reefed maintopsail foresail and fore topmast staysail at 9 A.M. took in the foresail and set the foretopmast in the afternoon the wind hauled W. saw several ships then in Lat 43, 44 Long 48, 36

Saturday Jan 14th

This day commences pleasant with light breezes from the N.W. at day light made sail steering on the wind with the starboard tack aboard in the afternoon set the main sail and maintopgallantsail the wind hauled to the S. by E. saw several ships Lat 43, 20 Long 48, 41 NE

Sunday Jan 15th

This day commences squally with fresh breezes from the S. by E. laying too under close reefed maintopsail and mainsheet in the afternoon it cleared of pleasant with light breezes from the S. by E. steering on the wind to the W. with all sail set at night took in sail saw nothing Lat 44, 01 Long 48, 39 E

Monday Jan 16th

This day commences squally with strong breezes from the E. at daylight set single reefed topsail and jib at 4 A.M. took in sail hove the under close reefed maintopsail mainsheet and foretopmast staysail at 10 A.M. it came on to blow a heavy gale too in the maintopsail in the afternoon it came on fog saw several ships then with a heavy gale set no observation

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
