Monday Feb 6th

This day commenced cloudy with fresh breezes from the N & frequent squalls & rain. Laying too under close reefed main topsail & reefed foresail at 2 P.M. cleared up & the wind shifted to the W made sail steering on the wind to the N saw several Whales but it was so rough we could not get nigh them saw two ships a whaling, thus ends pleasant with light breezes
Lat 44, 47 Long

Tuesday Feb 7th

This day commenced pleasant with light breezes from the W at daylight made sail at 5 A.M. saw several Whales but could not nigh them at 8 A.M. saw one whale 4 miles off lowered & pulled for him and huck him & killed him brought him along side & cut him in & started the tryworks spoke the Barque Nimrod at 10 Whales thus ends with thick fog at night took in sail
Lat 44 14 Got no Altitude

Wednesday Feb 8th

This day commenced cloudy with light breezes from the E at 8 A.M. made sail steering on the wind to the N in company with the Nimrod both boiling then at night took in sail lowered the boat and went on board of the Nimrod thus ends fog
Set no observation

Thursday Feb 9th

This day commenced cloudy with light breezes from the E at day made sail & lowered the boats & struck two whales & killed them & brought them along side & cut them in started the tryworks & took in sail thus ends with thick fog & fresh breezes
Got no observation

Friday Feb 10th

This day commenced thick foggy at day light called all hands broke out the fore hatch and stowed down the oil boiling saw several right whales but did not lower thus ends cloudy wind I saw two ships
Got no observation

Saturday

Sunday Feb 11th

This day commenced pleasant with light breezes from the W at day light made sail steering on the wind to the E spoke the Palladium N. L. Capt. Bentice 12, 50 lbs 18 months out, in the afternoon broke out the main topsail & stowed down the oil saw several right whales & took in sail
