Commences pleasant with fresh breezes from the N steering S by W with all sail set at night took in sail & luffed too at daylight made sail steering S by W saw several sulphur bottoms this morn

Commences pleasant with fresh breezes from the N steering S by W with all sail set at night took in sail & luffed too made foggy at daylight made sail steering S by W with all sail wind W, S, W saw several finbacks

Saturday Dec 30th

Commences pleasant with light breezes from the N steering on the wind at 2 P.M. saw two sail at 3 the wind hauled to N, W, W at 5 P.M. spoke the Hancock & saw Harbour no oil took part squally & fresh ga set the foresail thus ends

Sunday Dec 30th

at Commences squally with fresh breeze from the N at 1 P.M. set the fore topsail & foresail steering on the wind at night took in sail at daylight made all sail steering S by E thus ends

January 1st 1844

A new year & a happy one I hope Commences pleasant with light breezes from the E, S, E steering on the wind to the E, S, E at 1 P.M. spoke the Meteor of Green 1800 mts 16 months out Capt J. Byrrows at 6 took in sail spoke the Halcyon N.E. Capt Bailey 200 mts 5 months out also saw 6 or 8 other ships middle part foggy at daylight set the foresail saying too, foggy, so ends, saw nothing

Tuesday Jan 2nd

Commences pleasant with fresh breeze from the N, E & made sail steering on the wind at night took in sail saw three ships at daylight made all sail steering on the wind to the E wind N, W, E saw nothing thus ends
