Sunday Jan 21st

Commences squally with strong breezes from the N steering on the wind under double reefed topsails & foresail at 3 P.M. took in sail blowing fresh middle part squally at daylight set double reefed topsails at 7 & saw several right whales lowered but could not strike them it being so rough came on board & took in sail at 10 set the fore topsails thus ends plenty of whales

Monday Jan 22nd

Commences squally with fresh breezes from the W steering on the wind under double reefed topsails & foresail jib & spanker at 2 lowered struck & got stove at night took in sail middle part fog with light breezes at daylight made all sail steering on the wind at 9 came in fog thus ends saw 6 ships

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Tuesday Jan 23rd

Commences pleasant with fresh breeze from the N steering on the wind with all sail set saw several right whales lowered & struck one killed & brought him along side & cut him in took in sail middle part squally with fresh gales from the S.E. laying too at 11 set double reefed topsails & foresail steering on the wind thus ends

Wednesday Jan 24th

Commences pleasant with light breeze from the S.W steering on the wind with all sail set spoke the Meteor of Groton Capt Burrows at 6 spoke the Washington at 8 Capt Coffin 16 months out 1400 lbs middle part strong breeze at daylight set double reefed topsails spoke the Barque Leader of Mystic Capt Avery 200 lbs thus ends saw no whales

Thursday Jan 25th

Commences cloudy with strong breeze from the N steering on the wind under double reefed topsails & foresail saw several ships took in sail middle part pleasant at daylight set double reefed topsails broke out the main hatch & stowed the oil can in thick took in sail thus ends saw 2 right whales got no obs
