him killed him brought him
along side & cut him in
took in sail at daylight made sail
steering on the wind at 3 P.M.
saw a dead whale lowered brought
him along side & cut him in
two ends

Commences pleasant with fresh breeze
from the N. steering on the wind
with whole topsails & foresail boiling
at night took in sail middle part
squally with fresh breezes at daylight
set double reefed topsail steering
on the wind saw several ships
saw two whales they were
Lat 44, 30
Long 50, 10E

Monday Jan 29th
Commences pleasant with fresh
breezes from the N. steering on the
wind with double reefed topsails
& foresail at night took in sail
middle part pleasant at daylight
broke out the main hatch & stowed
down the oil boiling spoke the
Comodore Perry at 1 P.M. Capt
Hempstead & the Julius Caesar A.B.
Brun 1500
Lat 44, 44S
Long 49, 42E

Tuesday Jan 30th
Commences fog with fresh breeze
from the E. & laying too under close
reefed maintopsail & foresail stowing
down at 2 P.M. set double reefed
topsails steering on the wind saw
several ships at night took in
sail middle part fog at daylight
set double reefed topsails steering
on the wind spoke the Meteor
Groton this end
