Saturday March 2<sup>nd</sup>  
Commences squally with strong gales from the N laying too under close reefed main topsail & foresail middle part the same later part foggy took in the foresail thus ends saw nothing Got no obser

Sunday March 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Commences with heavy gales from the N laying too under close reefed maintopsail foretopmast staysail & mainstender at 3 P.M. wore round middle part at 7 P.M. took in the main topsail blowing heavy at 2 P.M. set the maintopsail later part the same thus ends saw nothing

The 3<sup>rd</sup> of Long 51, 26 Lat 43, 31

Monday March 4<sup>th</sup>  
Commences squally with fresh gales from the W laying too under close reefed maintopsail & reefed foresail middle part more moderate at daylight broke out & steered down the oil at 9 A.M. made sail steering on the wind saw two whales lowered & struck one & sounded out the line the crew pleasant

Commences pleasant with fresh breezes from the W steering on the wind with topsails & courses at night took in sail middle part squally at daylight set double reefed topsails & courses steering on the wind saw one whale going quick lowered but could not get near him thus ends

Wednesday March 6<sup>th</sup>  
Commences pleasant with light breezes from the W steering on the wind to the N.W. with all sail set at night took in sail at daylight made sail steering on the wind to the S.W. saw nothing

Commences cloudy with fresh breeze from the W.S.W. steering on the wind to the S.W. at sundown saw one right whale lowered & struck him came on dark & cut took in sail middle part squally at daylight set double reefed topsails & courses wind S.W. steering W saw several sulphur bottoms thus ends
