Tuesday March 2nd

All these 24 hours lying at anchor the Capt and the care of a Doctor

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Wednesday March 3rd

All these 24 hours lying at anchor waiting for the Capt

Thursday March 4th

All these 24 hours fine weather lying at anchor waiting for the Capt who is improving

Friday March 5th

All these 24 hours fine weather lying at anchor Capt still improving

Saturday March 6th

Worst part of these 24 hours lying at anchor at 1 P.M. the Capt came on board his health very much improved at 2 P.M. got underway and stood to sea toward anchor and chains latter part heading to the S.E. wind S.S.W.
