 in Royal harbor at 4 o'clock got under way  
 and stood out of the harbor  
 Middle part cloudy with a strong breeze  
 ship running S.E. with all sail set at 2  
 o'clock at 11 hauled to S.E. 1/2 S. latter part S.E.  
 no observations

Oct 31<sup>th</sup>

This twenty four hours commenced with strong  
 breeze from the N. ship running S.E. by S.  
 under all sail middle part the same  
 latter part more moderate wind S.E. by S.  
 ship heading S.E.

Nov 1<sup>st</sup>

This day commenced with light winds from E. by S.  
 ship heading S.E. at 5 o'clock wind N.W.  
 ship running S.E. by S. middle part wind  
 light and clear latter part fine breeze  
 from the S.W. ship steering S.E. by S.

Sunday Nov 2<sup>nd</sup>

This day commenced with a fine breeze  
 from the S.W. with cloudy weather  
 at 5 P.M. wind West ship running S. by E.  
 Middle part squally latter part moderate breeze  
 from W.S.W. at 11 A.M. saw a shoal of fin backs
