

Remarks on board Thursday Nov 27th 1862

This twenty four hours commenced with fine weather and moderate breezes from S.E. ship by the wind heading S.W. by S. at one o'clock saw St. Pauls Island employed setting up foretopgallant rigging and sent up main topgallant sail. Middle weather the same wind S.E. at 2 O'clock. Tacked ship and ship headed E. latter part fine ship by the wind St. Pauls island to the windward repairing spars.

Remarks on board Friday Nov 28th

This day commenced fine at 12 o'clock tacked ship and stood to the S.W. by S. under all sail. Middle part weather fine with a moderate breeze. Ship by the wind. Latter part weather the same wind S.E. ship by the wind heading S.W. at 6 O'clock. Tacked ship and headed E. employed repairing sails too sails insight.

Remarks on board Saturday Nov 29th

This day commenced with cloudy weather and a strong breeze from S.E. ship by the wind heading East saw a bark to the leeward heading E. middle part strong breeze banded fore and main topgallant sails. Latter part strong breeze from S.E. day light made sail ship heading E. so ends.

Remarks on board Sunday Nov 30th 1862

This day commenced with cloudy weather and a moderate breeze from S.E. past St. Pauls island distance 10 miles at 4 P.M. wind hauled suddenly to E. S.E. Middle part cloudy with a strong breeze banded topgallant sails. Latter part fine weather and a moderate breeze S.E. ship by the wind under all sail.

Remarks on board Monday Dec 1st 1862

This twenty four hours commenced with cloudy weather and a moderate breeze from the S.E. at 4 P.M. came on squally with rain banded foretopgallant sail and flying jib. Middle part still squally double reefed fore topsail single reefed main. Latter part fine with a moderate breeze from the S.E. ship under all sail by the wind.

Remarks on board Tuesday Dec 2nd 1862

This twenty four hours commenced with fine weather and small breezes from the S.E. ship by the wind S.W. heading at 3 P.M. saw a shoal of black fish. Middle part fine wind light. Latter part weather good moderate breeze from S.E. ship by the wind heading S.W. by S. under all sail at 9 O'clock. past an English bark heading to the eastward saw a brig to the leeward.
