Remarks on board Saturday June 20th 1863

This day commenced with squally weather and moderate breezes at 4 P.M. let go the starboard anchor in St Helena harbor with 60 fathoms of chain middle and latter part the same

Remarks on board Sunday June 21st

This twenty four hours lying at anchor in St Helena harbor starboard wach on shore

Remarks on board Monday June 22nd

This twenty four hours lying at anchor in St Helena harbor larboard wach on shore

Remarks on board Tuesday June 23rd

lying at anchor in St Helena harbor this twenty four hours

Remarks on board Wednesday June 24th

still lying at anchor in the harbor of St Helena had company on board

Remarks on board Thursday June 25th

This twenty four hours lying at anchor at 6 o'clock went on shore middle part lying at anchor latter part fine at 10 A.M. took the anchor and stood out to sea

Cruising off St Helena

Remarks on board Friday June 26th 1863

This twenty four hours commenced with fine weather and moderate breezes from the S.E. ship by the wind with all sail set middle and latter part the same

Remarks on board Saturday June 27th

This twenty four hours commenced with fine weather and moderate breezes ship under all sail middle and latter parts strong breezes from S.E. ship with all light sails banded land bearing S.W.

Remarks on board Sunday June 28th

This day commenced with strong winds from the S.E. ship under single reefed topsails at 2 P.M. took in the main sail at sun down double reefed the topsails banded jib and spanker middle part banded fore topsail blowing very strong latter part still blowing strong at day light set fore topsail

Remarks on board Monday June 29th

This day commenced with strong breezes from the S.E. ship by the wind under double reefed topsails middle and latter part the same land bearing west N. West distant 8 miles
