This day commenced with strong breezes from the S.E. ship running to South and East under small sail middle part blowing strong at 3 P.M. took in all sail but fore topmast stay sail & main spencer latter part the same

This twentyfour hours commenced with squally weather ship under fore topmast stay sail and main spencer middle part the same latter part more moderate but the top sails wind from the South West ship running to the South East

This day commenced with moderate winds from the South and Westward ship running S.E. with double reefed top sails and courses middle part the same latter part fine weather with light winds at 6 P.M. made all sail ship by the wind to the Eastward

Remarks on board Wednesday July 20th 1864

This day commenced with fine weather and light winds from the S.E. ship by the wind heading off one sail off the larboard beam heading to the S.E. middle and latter part with a moderate breeze from the Eastward ship by the wind heading to South and Eastward with all sail set

Remarks on board Thursday July 21th

This twentyfour hours commenced with fine weather and moderate winds from the S.E. ship with all sail set running to the S.E. employed brackeing out for provisions and water middle part squally weather ship with all sail set latter part strong breezes from the S.W. with rain squalls at noon double reefed the top sails so clouds
