

Bound Towards Mattapoisett

Remarks Friday Oct 21st 1864

This day begins with slight winds from E. S. ship running to the N. by W with all sail at 8 o'clock we hauled to the S and squally middle part the same latter part blowing strong from the S. W. at day light took in all sail and took reefed main top sail and fore sail main spencer & top mast stay sail

Lat 39.39. N Long 49.15 W

Remarks Saturday Oct 22nd

This day begins with strong breezes from the S. W. ship lying under close reefed main top sail at 3 P.M. had a very heavy squall took in main top sail middle weather the same latter part still blowing from S. W. ship under main spencer and top mast stay sail

Lat 39.46 N Long 48.25 W

Remarks Sunday Oct 23rd

This day comes in with a gale from the North ship lying under main spencer & fore top mast stay sail middle some clearing set set main and fore sail fore sail fore spencer and main sail latter part fine middle all sail wind North ship standing W by N sent up fore top sail and yard

Lat 39.26 N Long 46.35 W

Remarks Monday Oct 24th

This day begins fine weather ship steering N. by W. ship with all sail at dark took in top gallant sail 3 o'clock double reefed the top sails middle part blowing strong from the S. W. at 1 o'clock the S. W. of the main top sail gave out took in all sail except main spencer and fore top mast stay sail and sent the main top sail down latter blowing heavy

Remarks Tuesday Oct 25th

This day begins with a gale of wind from the N. W. ship lying under main spencer & fore top mast sail sent up main top sail middle part more moderate at 3 P.M. set the main top sail latter part wind North and moderate ship with all sail steering N. W.

Remarks Wednesday Oct 26th

This day begins with cloudy weather and a light wind from the E. S. ship steering West with all sail middle part rising double reefed the top sails at 3 P.M. wind hauled to E. W. latter part quite good weather at 8 P.M. saw a school of sperm whales going to the Eastward last heard toward and got a whale

Lat 40.05 N Long 49.00 W

Remarks Thursday Oct 27th

Begins with fresh winds and very rugged at 1 P.M. took a whale a long side and went that in thing at 5 had him all in middle part strong winds very squally took in main top sail employed clearing up latter part blowing strong cleared up main top sail bare ship employed cutting up debris

Lat 40.05 N Long 49.15 W

Remarks Friday Oct 28th

This day begins blowing very hard made the head fast rolled up and turned up starboard boat and took in main top sail middle part still blowing hard latter part more pleasant at 9 P.M. set main top sail employed cutting up the head and started the washes wind to the Eastward steering West

Lat 39.50 N Long 48.15 W
