Remarks Monday Nov 14 1864

This day begins with strong breezes from the West ship by the vessel heading S.W. under double reefed main topsail fore sail & main spencer & fore top mast staysail state in the gulf middle part more moderate about equally set the fore topsail latter part blowing strong from the S.W. at 5 o'clock took in fore topsail at 10 o'clock more moderate set fore topsail again Lat 31.8 Long 65.38 1/2

Remarks Tuesday Nov 15 1864

This day begins with strong winds from the S.W. ship under double reefed top sails & fore sail main spencer & fore top mast staysail heading S.W. middle part equally ship with the same sail at 3 o'clock set the main sail latter part fore moderate breeze from the S.W. ship heading N.W. at 8 o'clock made all sail employed in fitting rigging Lat 26.20 Long 66.31 1/2

Remarks Wednesday Nov 16 1864

This twenty four hours begins with pleasant weather and light winds from the S.W. Westward all sail set at 9 o'clock a breeze from the S.W. by N. middle part strong breeze handed light sails latter part blowing very strong at day light double reefed the top sails and handed the main sail

Lat 21.00 Long 67.00

Remarks Thursday Nov 17 1864

This day begins with a strong breeze from the S.W. ship by the wind heading N.W. under double reefed top sails & courses at 8 o'clock to the South middle part more moderate made all sail ship heading N.W. same as before latter part moderate breezes upon the S.W. ship steering S.W. with all sail

Remarks Friday Nov 18 1864

This day begins with moderate breezes from the S.W. ship steering S.W. with all sail employed pointing middle part light winds from S to S.W. all sail set heading S.W. by N. latter part pleasant weather and a moderate breeze from S.W. all sail set steering S.W. by N. Lat 27.40 Long 68.38 1/2

Long by sun obs. 69.00 1/2

Remarks Saturday Nov 19 1864

This day begins with pleasant weather & light winds from the S.W. ship with all sail at 4 o'clock strong breeze took in top mast standing sail ship steering S.W. cleaned the cutting spades & painted them ship in the gulf stream middle part at 10 o'clock took in light sail at 1 o'clock wind hauled to the North in a squally state in all sail but close reefed main topsail main spencer & fore top mast staysail at 2 o'clock set double reefed top sails again being quite moderate heading S.W. latter part at day light moderate breeze upon the S.W. ship heading S.W. made all sail at 9 o'clock took top galley sails in and double reefed fore topsail it blowing quite strong ship start of the gulf stream

Remarks Sunday Nov 20 1864

This day begins with a moderate breeze from the S.W. ship heading S.W. under top sails and courses at 3 o'clock set all sail wind hauled to the S.W. kept the ship S.W. middle part strong breezes from the S.W. ship steering S.W. with all sail at 11 o'clock rounded on bottom latter part still blowing strong from S.W. Eastward steering S.W. saw on ship board to S. in obs
