Bark Peru of Connecticut off the Galapagos Island
Monday 11th

Commences with strong breezes from the S lead by the wind to the E at 1 P.M. part of the night into the S and saw Bimbaré Baring P.S. 15 miles and ship and 2 Barks in sight middle the same latter part equally saw Gauder Island Baring P.S. 10 miles Dist 280 Ends

Tuesday 12th

Commences with strong breezes from the S lead by the wind to the E sent one boat in a fishing at 4 returned with a large quantity of fish and ship in sight middle and latter strong breezes and equally saw pinkbacks 250 Ends

Lat 00-54 S Longt 83-
Wednesday 13th

Commences with strong breezes and equally from the S lead to the E middle the same latter part moderate get out water and set up the main topmast stay 250 Ends Steer E 80

Thursday 14th

Commences with moderate breezes from the S by the wind to the E employed at setting up the main topmast back stays middle the same latter the same employed at setting up the main topmast back stays 250 Ends

Friday 15th

Commences with strong breezes from the S by the wind to the E employed at setting up rigging at 1 P.M. saw Spume Whales lower and spike one and lost whale and line the whale spouting blood when first seen middle part strong breezes lead to the E and W latter the same thick and squally at 11 A.M. saw a lead whale made a boat and went to him found he was not good saw a ship heading to the E 250 Ends

Saturday 16th

Commences with strong breezes from S to S.W. lead by the wind to the E middle part the same latter tack to the S.W. employed at breaking out in the main hatch for Baeal and tow lines at 9 P.M. exchanged signals with the ship President of New Bedford 250 Ends

Sunday 17th

Commences with strong breezes and equally from the S tack to the E middle and latter parts the same

Monday 18th

Commences with moderate breezes from the S steering E 80 middle at 1 P.M. by the wind to the E latter strong breezes double reef the top sails saw one pinkback 250 Ends

Lat 00-58 S Longt 84-
Tuesday 19th

Commences with breezes from the S by the wind to the E under double reefs middle part part a bark heading to the W latter strong breeze and rainy 250 Ends

Lat 01-10 S Longt 84-
Wednesday 20th

Commences with strong breezes from the S with thick clouds weather lead by the wind to the E under double reefs middle tack to the W latter moderate tack to the E set whale top sails employed at setting up mizen rigging 250 Ends

Lat 01-15 S Longt 84-
Thursday 21th

Commences with light breezes from the S lead by the wind to the E at 1 P.M. saw the Island of da la Plater 5 Spoke the ship Gazelle of Connecticut 45 months out 1150 lbs. Spume middle part calm latter strong breezes and squally one ship in sight 250 Ends

Lat 01-20 S Longt 84-
Friday 22nd

Commences with light breezes from the S lead by the wind to the W middle part equally double reef the top sails latter the same one ship in sight 250 Ends

Lat 00-45 S Longt 85-
Saturday 23rd

Commences with strong breezes from the S lead by the wind to the W under double reefs middle the same latter set whale top sails tack to the E get meat and water one ship in sight 250 Ends

Lat 00-40 S Longt 85-05 W
Sunday 24th

Commences with strong breezes and thick squally weather from the S lead by the wind to the E at 5 P.M. exchanged signals with the ship President of New Bedford at second double reef middle part the same latter part tack to the S W one ship in sight 250 Ends
