Bark Peru of Nantucket

Monday 25<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with moderate breezes from the S lead by the to the W middle and latter parts the crime one ship in sight 80 ends

Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with moderate breezes from the S with thick haze weather lead by the wind to the E middle the same latter the same made all sail one ship in sight employed at ship duty 80 ends

Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with strong breezes from the S with thick weather lead by the wind to the E taking the Morn topgallant sail at 4 P.M. and a Branch off the lee bow run per it saw nothing of it middle part taking flying jib and top sail latter moderate made sail employed at ship duty 80 ends

Thursday 28<sup>th</sup>  
Commences moderate breezes from the S lead by wind to the E with thick haze weather at 6 P.M. tack to the W middle the same latter part light breezes and fine weather tack to the E employed at ship duty 80 ends

Friday 29<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with light breezes and pleasant weather from the S lead by the wind to the E one ship in sight at 4 P.M. saw the ship boats chasing tacked and stood towards her saw that she was chasing Blackfish to the E again middle the same latter part at 2 o'clock tack to the W at 4 o'clock tack to the E one ship in sight employed at ship duty 80 ends

Saturday 30<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with light breezes from the S with pleasant weather at 2 P.M. saw Bark chasing Whales run for her but nothing of the Whales middle part spoke the Bark Reaka of Bedford has with the fore top sail aback latter part lead to the E two sails in sight 80 ends

Sunday 31<sup>st</sup>  
Commences with light breezes from the S and fine weather lead by the wind to the E at 6 P.M. tack to the W at 2 middle part tack to the E latter the same 2 sails in sight

Sept  
Bark Peru of Nantucket Bound to Hamburg September 1855

Monday 1<sup>st</sup>  
Commences with light breezes from the S lead by the wind to the E sails in sight heading to the E middle the same latter the same sails in sight employed at ship duty 80 ends

Tuesday 2<sup>d</sup>  
Commences with moderate breezes from the S lead by the wind to the E with thick weather middle part strong breezes taking light sails latter part light breezes make all sail at 6 P.M. saw Humphreys baron the boat could not strike at 8 saw the main land 15 miles distant 80 ends

Wednesday 3<sup>d</sup>  
Commences with light breezes from the S steering E by N saw sail and masts of Humphreys at sundown lufft to the wind to the W the fore top sail aback the land 8 miles distant middle part the same latter part steer for Hamburg get the anchor off the bow 3 sails in sight 80 ends

Thursday 4<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with light breezes from the S at 2 P.M. came in 5 fathoms of water middle part the same latter part at 12 o'clock on shore for water 80 ends

Friday 5<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with pleasant weather lying at anchor middle and latter the same employed at blacking the ship bands 80 ends

Saturday 6<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with pleasant weather lying at anchor employed at getting off water blacking bands and getting on board recruits

Sunday 7<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with pleasant weather lying at anchor middle and latter part the same

Monday 8<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with pleasant weather lying at anchor middle part the same latter employed at standing water

Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with pleasant weather lying at anchor middle and latter the same employed at getting off ballast
