

Sept 1855
Bark Peru of Connecticut lying at Anchor at Lunenburg

Wednesday 10th
Commenced with pleasant weather employed at getting off recruits
middle and latter the same

Thursday 11th
Commenced with pleasant weather lying at Anchor middle
and latter parts the same

Friday 12th
Commenced with pleasant weather lying at Anchor middle
the same latter part at 6 AM took our Anchor and
commenced working up the coast for Payta 30 Cuts
gave the men a passage

Saturday 13th
Commenced with light baffling winds working up the
coast middle and latter part the same Exchange signals
with a Spanish Bark

Sunday 14th
Commenced with light breezes from the S working
up the coast middle and latter the same with strong breeze
Satt 3-41 & brought - - off

Monday 15th
Commenced with strong breezes from the S working up
the coast taking the light sails middle the same latter part
more moderate set light sails

Tuesday 16th
Commenced with strong breezes from the S working up
the coast middle and latter part the same with light breezes
make all sail saw Payta Head bearing S by S 15 miles dist

Wednesday 17th
Commenced with light breezes from the S at 4 PM came to
Anchor in Payta Harbour in 9 fathoms of water middle the
same latter employed at painting the ship outside

Thursday 18th
Commenced with fine weather employed at painting inside
and out sent 4 men and the 2 boys ashore on liberty for
no stated time

Friday 19th
Commenced with fine weather employed at painting middle
and latter the same

Saturday 20th
Commenced with fine weather employed at painting middle
the same sent all hands ashore but 4 on liberty for no
stated time

Sunday 21st
Commenced with fine weather all hands ashore middle
and latter part the same

Monday 22nd
Commenced with fine weather all hands ashore middle
and latter part the same

Tuesday 23rd
Commenced with fine weather middle and latter parts the
same the men on liberty

Wednesday 24th
Commenced with fine weather middle and latter parts the
same

Thursday 25th
Commenced with fine weather the men all aboard but
Charles Waller Charles St. Riley Thomas Yale sent middle
and latter part getting ready for sea

Friday 26th
Commenced with fine weather waiting to try to catch the
peruvian men middle and latter the same ship so canos
bark bearing S.

Saturday 27th
Commenced with fine weather middle the same latter part
took the barbaad Anchor on the bow leave short and leave
sails

Sunday 28th
Commenced with fine weather at 1 PM got under way and stood
to sea entered the Anchor and cables middle head to the S W
latter part from 7 to 12 beat to the S at noon took to
the S W again saw the ship bark

Satt 5-10 & brought - - off
