of 4 employed at ship duty at sundown took  
the light sail and off to the wind to the S W  
middle part the same latter part fresh breeze

Lat 10-43 Longt 84-50  
Thursday 12<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with fresh breezes and fine weather. From the S  
turning W & W Middle part the same weather part S & S W  
W and made all sail employed at ship duty

Lat 43° 38' S Longt 96° 00'  
 Friday 13<sup>th</sup>  
 Commenced with light breezes and fine weather from  
 the S steering by the wind to the Westward Middle  
 and latter parts the same nothing in sight

Lat 14-15 N Longt 87-20  
Saturday 14<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with fresh breezes from the S steering  
by the wind to the N Middle and latter parts  
the signal

Lat 46-14 N Longt 99-15  
Sunday 15<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with Fresh Breezes from the S. Steering  
by the wind to the W Middle part charted  
sail Lat. part sand Banks ahead 1 sail  
in sight

Sailed  
 Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> 1866  
 Commanded with Light Breezes and fine weather from  
 the I. Cruising off Whinston Island at 3 P.M. Spoke  
 Barque Cape Horn Pigeon and Catapa Middle  
 part the same latter part the same 3 sails  
 in sight.

South of Longport  
Sunday 14th  
Commenced with light Breezes and fair weather from  
the S. Cruising of Alhington. Part the same  
rather part thick weather at daylight saw Whales  
going first to the individual band and Chace did not go  
near them at 12 took up the Boats

Barque Peru of Cranstucket Cruising off Whitington Island  
 Wed. nearly 12<sup>th</sup>  
 Commenced with light breeze and fine weather at 5 PM  
 saw <sup>at</sup> whales going quick to windward did not  
 hauler Middle part the same better part & strong  
 breezes off Whitington 3 sails in sight

South of Saugat  
 Thursday 19<sup>th</sup>  
 commenced with moderate breeze and fine weather  
 B sail in sight employed at ship duty. Middle part  
 the same latter part saw a ship whaling to  
 the Seeward kept off for her but saw no whales  
 B sight

Light  
 Bridg 2<sup>d</sup> <sup>Satt</sup> <sup>the</sup> August  
 commenced with light breezes and fine weather at  
 2 PM saw 4 Whales hauled and chase got nothing  
 the Barque Catalpa Boat, in company saw the  
 ship James Hager of Nantucket get a Whale  
 Middle and latter parts sent to the E B sail

South O'Harney  
Saturday 21<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with strong Breeze from the S & P  
beach by the wind to the P. Middle part the same  
further part beach to the S. S. All Whingtons in sight

Satt. 22<sup>nd</sup> August  
Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup>  
Commenced with strong Breeze from the S  
cruising off Abington Middle and latter part  
the same

Lath. O'Langt  
 Monday 23<sup>rd</sup>  
 commenced with strong breeze from the S  
 driving off Kingston & taking the Bark  
 Helen Mar of New Bedford had lost her  
 2<sup>nd</sup> mate by a blanket piece falling from  
 the Mast and latter part wind got out of the
