Bark Perla of Vantucket Bound to the E
Wednesday 3rd
Commenced with light breezes from the E heading
by the wind to the S at 1 P.M. took finish Bailing
Middle & latter part the same

Sat 14th 20th Long 88-51 W
Thursday 4th
Commenced with light breezes from the S heading
by the wind to the E Middle & latter part
the same employed at Mending bare topmast
& stay sail

Sat 15th 16th Long 88-14 W
Friday 5th
Commenced with Moderate breeze from the S heading
by the wind to the E S E employed at Mending
Jib Middle & latter part the same employed
at putting new ratlines to the Fore & Main rigging

Sat 16th 10th Long 88-34
Saturday 6th
Commenced with light breezes from the S E
heading by the wind to the E Middle and latter
part the same saw a schooner heading to the
S E employed at the rigging

Sat 17th 10th Long 88-34
Sunday 7th
Commenced with light breezes from the E
heading to the S E at sundown took
to the S E Middle & latter part the same

Sat 18th 25th Long 87-04
Monday 8th
Commenced with Moderate breezes from the
E heading to the S E Middle part the
same latter part wind E S E head S by W
employed at fitting rigging first a bark heading
to the E

Sat S Long

Feb 18th 1858
Bark Perla of Vantucket Bound South
Tuesday 9th
Commenced with Moderate breezes from the E S E
heading to the S E employed at fitting rigging
Middle part the same latter part light breeze
at 6 A.M. saw Whales to the Windward border for
them at 10 A.M. struck one Whale at Chaw East
the Whale and line the Whale spouting blood

Sat 10th 10th Long
Wednesday 10th
Commenced Moderate breezes from the E S E heading
to the Windward side Boats off Chawing at 5 P.M.
pick up the first Whale but no line at 8 P.M.
took him the ship Middle part by the Whale
to the E S E latter part of daylight saw ship
to the S W and cut at 10 A.M. finished

Sat 11th 52nd S Long 88-21
Thursday 11th
Commenced with strong breezes from the E S E heading
by the wind to the E S E Middle part get ready
for Bailing latter part light hailing winds &
heavy rain at 9 A.M. saw Whales border and strike
one at 10 took him to the ship and chase

Sat 12th 44th S Long
Friday 12th
Commenced with light breezes from the E heading
Whale at 4 P.M. came onboard the Whales gone out
of sight commenced cutting and Bailing at 6 finished
cutting Middle part Bailing latter part light hailing
winds and heavy rain put out the fire and quiet Bailing
one ship in sight at 10 A.M. saw the ship Boats
chasing border but saw nothing

Sat 13th 35th S Long 88-41 W
Saturday 13th
Commenced with light hailing winds employed at Bailing
at 1 P.M. saw Whales border but got nothing Middle
Moderate breezes from the S head to the E latter part
finished Bailing one ship in sight cutting
Sat S Long
