Bark Peruv of Antioch Bound to Calcutta
Sunday 4th

Commenced with strong breeze from the ESE at 1 PM took
in the standing sail and steer ESE Middle part the same
latter part the wind from NW steer E by S
Lat 31-41 S Long 95-15 W

Monday 5th
Commenced with strong breeze from the ESE steering
E by S Middle part the same latter part moderate
breeze from the ESE steer E and the standing
sails employed at hatching the foremast rigging got out
water
Lat 32-45 S Long 92-35 W

Tuesday 6th
Commenced with moderate breeze from the ESE steering
E Middle and latter parts the same with strong
breeze employed at hatching foremast rigging
Lat 33-36 S Long 89-26 W

Wednesday 7th
Commenced with fresh gale from the WNW steering
E Middle part blowing a gale took in the light
sails and double reefed the topsails and yards the
main sail latter part moderate breeze from the
SW made all sail and steer E by S
Lat 34-46 S Long 86-28 W

Thursday 8th
Commenced with moderate breeze from WNW to SW
steering E Middle and latter parts the same at
7 AM saw 3 whales hump too and under but saw
nothing more of them at 8 took up the boats
and steer E
Lat 35-11 S Long 84-30 W

Friday 9th
Commenced with moderate breeze from the W steering
E Middle part light breeze from the ESE latter part
strong breeze from the WNW to ESE
Lat 35-44 S Long 82-10 W

Saturday 10th
Commenced with strong breeze from the ESE steering
E Middle and latter part much the same
Lat 36-42 S Long 79-12 W

Apr 1858
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Sunday 11th

Commenced with strong breeze from the ESE and
steering to the E Middle part the same steering E
latter part strong breeze from the W and squally
steering E by S taking in the light sails and double
reefed the topsails
Lat 36-58 S Long 75-42 W

Monday 12th
Commenced with strong breeze from the S steering
ESE under double reefed topsails and courses
Middle part moderate made all sail latter part
light breeze from the S at daylight saw the
Mainland bearing E 20 miles distant steer E by S
Lat 37 S Long 71 W

Tuesday 13th
Commenced with moderate breeze from the S steering
for the Bay of Calcutta at 4 PM got the anchors off
the bow Middle part light air and calm working up the
the Bay latter part at 9 PM came too anchor in 4 fathoms
of water

Wednesday 14th
Commenced with fine weather employed at getting ready
for water from this day to the 25 employed at getting
off water painting & calkers employed at calking the
stern & bows with much blowing & rainy weather
from the E 3 men deserted William Ferguson Walter Robinson

Monday 26th
Commenced with fine weather employed at extending water
Middle and latter part the same

Tuesday 27th
Commenced with fine weather employed at mending jabs
about the ship Middle the same latter part strong
breeze from the ESE hands onboard to ruged to take
onboard recruits

Wednesday 28th
All these 24 hours strong breeze from the E and rainy
took on board 40 bbls of salt beef
