

May 1859
Park Tern of Wampanoag, Homeard Bound off Cape Horn
Saturday 28th

Commenced with strong breeze from the ESE heading by the wind to the ESE & Middle part equally taking the light sails & double reef the Top sail & latter part more moderate made all sail thick cloudy weather & snow squalls

Lat 46 150 S Long

Sunday 29th

Commenced with strong breeze from the ESE heading by the wind to the E at 4 PM took to the ESE Middle part the same latter calm at 11 AM took a heavy squall from the SSW taking light sails & double reef the Top sail with snow squalls

Lat 46 158 S Long

Monday 30th

Commenced with strong breeze from the SSW steering ESE under double reef Top sail & Fore sail at sundown more moderate set Main Mast Top sail & Main Top gallant sail Middle part wind from SSW to ESE with heavy snow squalls taking Main Top gallant sail latter part from 1 AM light wind from the ESE with moderate all sail at 11 AM strong breeze from the SSW steering ESE with heavy snow squalls 2 ships in sight steering to the ESE at 11 AM exchanged signals with an English Man of War

Tuesday 31st

Commenced with strong breeze from the SSW steering ESE by E Middle part the same latter part strong breeze & clear weather sent the Main royal yard & sail & set it

Lat 53 47 S Long 60 28 9000

Wednesday June 1st 1859

Commenced with strong breeze from the SSW steering ESE & squally Middle part wind from the SSE steering ESE by E & taking light sails latter part more moderate made all sail at 7 AM steering E at half past 7 saw the Easter Island and Cap Horn by bearing 11 miles distant

Lat 51 31 S Long 53 00

June 1859
Park Tern of Wampanoag, Homeard Bound off the coast of Patagonia
Thursday 2nd

Commenced with moderate breeze from the SSE steering ESE under all sail Middle part wind from S to SSW latter part wind W & strong breeze cloudy weather at 11 PM changed signals with a French ship steering to the S at dawn took in the light sails

Lat 49 11 S Long

Friday 3rd

Commenced with strong breeze from the W steering West at 7 PM took in the jib & Main sail Middle part took in Fore Top sail & Mast reef the Main Top sail latter part more moderate set Mast reef Top sail jib & Main sail

Lat 46 43 S Long 55 13

Saturday 4th

Commenced with strong breeze from the W steering ESE under Mast reef Top sail & Canvas & jib at sundown breeze freshening took in jib & Main sail Middle part took in Fore Top sail latter part blowing a gale took in Fore sail & hove the ship too under Mast reef Main Top sail & Main Spencer

Lat 45 40 S Long

Sunday 5th

Commenced with a gale from the WSW bying too under Mast reef Main Top sail Middle part the same latter part wind from the W kept the ship off W by E & set the Fore sail at 7 AM set Mast reef Fore Top sail at 9 set double reef Top sail

Lat 45 15 S Long 50 36

Monday 6th

Commenced with strong breeze from the WSW steering ESE by E under all sail Middle part the same latter part equally steering ESE

Lat 49 50 S Long 47 37
