

Bark Gabella in the <sup>Sea</sup> Anadas  
Saturday 21st June 1862

1st Fine wind S E Laying on different  
tacks, spoke Bark Barnstable Capt  
came on board sold 1 pr Boats 3,50 H & H's  
Sea to be declared at the Islands, latter  
past fine stood to the Land

Sunday 22nd

2nd Fine wind E Standing to the Land  
spoke Bark Fox sold some stores  
Middle past strong gales from N latter past  
Mott several ships around

Monday 23rd

3rd Mott light winds from SW Working  
around Middle & latter past same

Tuesday 24th

4th Light winds from the S working along  
shore spoke the bark Capt came on  
board Middle past fine latter do  
spoke Bark Krucansa

Wednesday 25th

5th Fine light airs from S working off  
T on sea a whale lowered & chased  
Middle past Mott steered to the W  
latter past fog & rain

Thursday 26th

6th Mott wind E Sun of to the Lee backing  
& filling Middle past foggy latter past  
fine steered of NW for Cape Behring  
Sun up to the Lee & Sun along to the  
S W Capt Hopping Stone came on board

Friday 27th

7th Fine wind NW Steering to the W along  
the Lee Middle past light airs latter do  
steering to the W all sail & sea clear water

Saturday 28th

8th Mott light airs from the E thick  
fog Lying about Middle past since  
latter past stood to the N

Bark Gabella, Anadas Sea 1862  
Sunday 29th June 1862

9th Light airs from the S E Standing to the  
E at 4 see all around, very heavy but open  
steered to the S Steered down Adams oil  
Middle past thick fog at 3 wind to head by  
E N E see the Land

Monday 30th

10th Wind strong at N E took in sail double  
reefed top sails wind S E at 5 made Cape  
Achen rose to the S thick & rainy  
Middle past thick fog latter do standing  
on different tacks 12 ships in sight

Tuesday 1st July 1862

11th Strong gales at S E Double reefs at 4 wind  
S Middle sail heading E S E ship in sight  
plenty of food & Birds, foggy, Mirving time  
Sea several humpbacks at 12 stood to the W  
at 7 tacked to the N E Standing into the  
Land 2 ships in sight

Wednesday 2nd

12th Mott wind E S E heading N E into place  
Bay, 7 or 8 ships at anchor at 6 tacked  
to the S, strong gales from N E, latter do working  
up to the Bay

Thursday 3rd

13th Strong gales at N E Working up under the  
Land, backing & filling off the Bay  
Middle past Mott stood to the South  
latter past Mott stood to the E

Friday 4th

14th Strong gales, Sun back off the Bay, took in  
sail steered to the E at eve made all sail  
Middle past fine latter past Mott stood  
the N all sail set

Saturday 5th

15th Wind E stood in to Indian point went on  
board of the Howland, working to the N  
foggy & rainy plenty of ice along the shore
