

Ship Sulacena of New Bedford Capt Dornan  
Friday Feb 10<sup>th</sup> 1854

Comes in with fresh breezes from S.S.E. the ship steering to the Westward at sunset shortened sail middle part equally latter part fine weather saw nothing  
Lat by obs. 34.50 Long by Chron. 84.28

Saturday Feb 11<sup>th</sup>

These twenty four hours with pleasant weather & good wholsail breeze from South the ship steering to the Westward at daylight bore ship to the East saw plenty of porpoises  
Lat by obs 34.53 Long by Chron 85.00

Sunday Feb 12<sup>th</sup>

This day comes in with moderate breezes from S.W. the ship steering S.E. at daylight saw a school of killers bowd. for them but could not get fast saw Finbacks & plenty of porpoises  
Lat by obs 35.07 Long by Chron 85.21

Monday Feb 13<sup>th</sup>

Comes in with good wholsail breeze from South the ship steering S.S.E. middle & latter part thick & foggy weather saw killers the Carpenter sick  
Lat by obs. 35.07 Long by Chron 81.46

Tuesday Feb 14<sup>th</sup>

Commences with moderate breeze from South middle part calm latter part light from SW saw a ship steering to the Eastward saw Finbacks the Carpenter & a Manacpa sick  
Lat 37.54 Long by Chron 80.30

Wednesday Feb 15<sup>th</sup>

Commences with fresh breezes from the Westward the ship steering S.S.E. middle part the wind veering to the Southward & heavy squalls saw nothing  
Lat by obs 39.09 Long by Chron 81.00

Thursday Feb 16. 1854

Comes in with fresh breezes from the Southward the ship steering to the Eastward middle part moderate latter part nearly calm saw nothing the Carpenter sick Lat 38.25 Long by Chron 87.28

Friday Feb 17<sup>th</sup>

This day comes in with fine weather & light breeze from the Southward at 10 A.M. spoke ship Lewis 6 months 40 bls Sperm Bount right whaling & sold us 9 Barrels of Potatoes saw no fish the Carpenter sick  
Lat by obs 38.28 Long by Chron 87.00

Saturday Feb 18

This day comes in with strong breezes from Southward the ship standing in to the Eastward middle part equally latter part more moderate saw Finbacks & Finbacks  
Lat by obs. 38.58 Long 85.00.

Sunday Feb 19<sup>th</sup>

Comes in with equally weather & strong breezes from the Southward the ship standing to the Eastward under double reefs. at 10 A.M. saw the Island of Nocha bearing N.E. 12 Leagues Dist. at noon about 20 miles S.W. by compass saw Finbacks & humpbacks

Monday Feb 20<sup>th</sup>

These twenty four hours fresh breezes from Southward the ship steering S.E. at sunset heeled to the Westward under short sail at daylight steered North W at 10. A.M. looked for Humpbacks and chased them two hours without success the Carpenter some better  
Lat by obs. 37.31 the land in sight
