

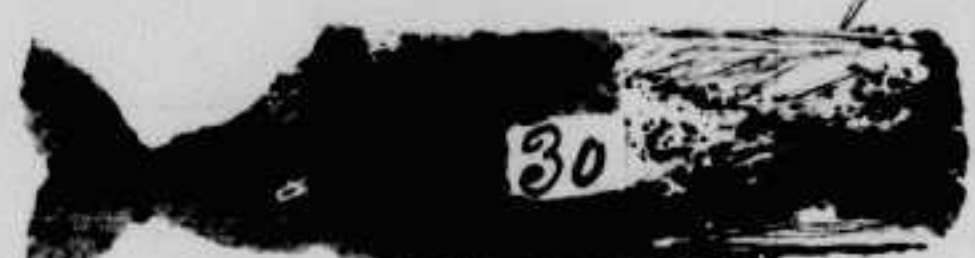
Ship. Balena of New Bedford. Capt. J. Dorman

Friday July 28th 1854

This day comes in with fine weather and light breeze the ship standing to the eastward latter part employed stowing oil Saw nothing
Lat by obs. 0.38 Long by Chron. 99.33

Saturday July 29th

This day comes in with fine weather and light breeze the ship standing to the eastward 5 P.M. Saw Whales going to the S.E. Lowered three Boats at 6 P.M. the Starboard Boat struck a small Whale and saved him took him along side about 7 P.M. at daylight cut him in Lat by obs. 0.58 Long by Chron. 99.40



Sunday July 30th

This day comes in with light breezes from the S.W. the ship standing off to the S.W. Middle and latter part very calm latter part employed boiling
Lat by obs. 0.36 Long by Chron. 100.36

Monday July 31st

This day comes in with light weather and pleasant breezes from S.E. the ship standing to the East
Saw nothing at daylight finished boiling
Lat by obs. 0.02 Long by Chron. 100.05

Tuesday July August 1st

This day comes in with fine weather the ship standing to the Westward at sunset tacked to the Eastward. Saw finbacks
Lat by obs. 0.05 Long by Chron. 100.38 W.

Wednesday August 2nd

This day comes in with gentle trades the ship standing off to the S.W.
Saw finbacks latter part stowing oil
Lat by obs. 0.25 Long by Chron. 100.54

Thursday Aug 3rd 1854

Comes in with fine weather and light trades the ship standing in to the Eastward employed stowing down oil finished about 3 P.M. Saw finbacks
Lat by obs. 0.08 Long by Chron. 100.28

Friday Aug 4th

This day comes in with gentle trade winds the ship standing in to the Eastward Saw nothing ends with strong breezes
Lat by obs. 0.08 Long by Chron. 99.54

Saturday Aug 5th

This day comes in with strong trades the ship on the Eastern tack at 1 P.M. Saw Whales going quick to Windward Lowered three Boats without success at ten A.M. took up the Boats and by the wind to the S.E. Mr. Charles Van Stueder off Duty Sick. he is subject to fits and has had several
Lat by obs. 0.55 Long by Chron. 99.55

Sunday Aug 6th

These twenty four hours fresh trades the ship working to Windward Saw porpoises
Lat by obs. 1.40 Long by Chron. 100.04

Monday Aug 7th

Comes in with fine weather and good Whol sail Breeze the ship standing to the Westward middle & latter part moderate Saw finbacks
Mry. Demonding is recovering slowly
Lat by obs. 0.35 Long by Chron. 100.35

Tuesday Aug 8th

This day comes in with light airs from the S.E. the ship standing to the Westward. Saw finbacks employed fitting reef tackle 1 block on the yards
Lat by obs. 0.06 Long by Chron. 100.17 W.
