Thursday June 21st

Moderate trades with fine weather. At 5 P.M. saw Chatham Island N.W. 15 miles. Hauech. Good Island N.W. 50 miles. No ship. E.S.E. & shortened sail for the night. Latter part saw bluish but did not succeed in taking any. No sails

Light trades with fine weather. All sail set. Saw many Porpoises & some floating squid. Latter part N.W. Employed variously.
