

Ship. Balaena of New Bedford Capt Dorman
1833. Monday Sept 13th
all hands employed getting off Wood & Wall
get off 500 Cords of Wood this Morning sent one
Boat to Blue Water shore on liberty

Tuesday Sept 14th
Employed painting getting off Wood & a Watch ashore
on liberty at Sunset Come on Board. one man Sick

Wednesday Sept 15th
Employed getting off Wood & potatoes one watch
ashore on liberty. got off two boats loads of potatoes
a man by the name of Smith shipped in Sack's and
from the ship along with a man of Sack's was taken
by Capt Dorman and was given up to him

Thursday Sept 16th
This day fine weather and clear sky one watch
ashore on liberty. at Sunset 1 Man of the Watch
came on Board. Benjamin Ford and John
Johnson a Boatsteerer Kanacka stayed ashore
18 hours after their liberty was expired Mr. C
could not come off because there was not men to
pull the Boat. Employed getting off Recruits

Friday Sept 17th
This day employed getting off Recruits
sent in a raft of 1 Cask for Water

Saturday Sept 18th
one watch ashore on liberty the Watch employed
getting off Recruits. Water &c. and stowing
them away

Sunday Sept 19th
This day Employed painting &c painted
Main Boat the Boatmen come on
Board at 6 P.M. with the exception
of Mr. Smith the Officer who remained
ashore to see the Doctor. being troubled with
a Stricture to Cords

Thursday Sept 20th

This day Employed fitting Boats &c one boat
Crew up the River getting flags. painted the
quarter Boats

Friday Sept 21st
fine weather and pleasant breeze
there has several vessel come in lately and some
gone the bow Boat up the River. Come on Board
about 5 P.M.

Saturday Sept 22^d
This day comes in with light Breezes off the land
at 11 A.M. got under weigh with a light breeze from the
Northward and stowed the Chains and anchors. discharged
one Man and shipped two Men and a boy George Smith was
claimed as a deserter from Ship Mary Ann of Fairhaven.
and was delivered up to her again at Wood Sombes bearing
6 by S. 10 Miles the Ship Mary Ann in company

Sunday Sept 23^d
Fresh trades the Ship steering to the Westward
at Sunset Shortened sail a Ship in sight steering
to the Westward. Last evening Capt Dorman spoke
to A. Johnson boatsteerer asking him why he got
drunk & broke his liberty telling him at the same time
that he made a Boatsteerer of him hoping to make
an arm of him. and now he had got drunk and destroyed
all the confidence placed in him. Johnson replied
that he was led away by others and requested to be
let go forward. the Capt told him to go. and appointed
Tom Kai Kanacka to take his place as Boatsteerer
Lat by 50 2 1/2 Long by Chron 82.02 P.M.

Monday Sept 24th
Comes in with fine weather and moderate trades
the Ship standing to the Westward at Sunset
Shortened sail sent two vessels standing to the
Westward Ends with light Breezes
Lat 1.31 Long 83.20
