Sunday March 7th in Salcahuano

This day comes in with fine weather & light
southerly winds the ships crew on watch ashore on
liberty untill nine P.M. Mr. Ray & Mr. Smith ashore
with three men Jack Manjia, Jose Portuge & Philipie as guards
without leave

Monday March 10th

This day comes in with fine weather middle & latter part
blowing from the Northward & raining hard. Jose came on
Board about 11 A.M. latter part rainy with fresh
breezes from the Northward Mr. Ray came on Board about
4 P.M. Mr. Smith ashore sick Jose came on board about 11 A.M.

Tuesday March 11th

These twenty four hours strong northerly
wind & rainy weather employed taking in Ballast from the
Ship Hector & stowing it away. Breaking out oil & a
Philippe & Jack Manjia came on board this morning

Wednesday March 12th

Comes in with light southerly winds
the ships crew employed putting oil on Board the
Hector put fifty sacks on board ends with light
northerly winds & rainy weather

Thursday March 13th

Blowing hard from the Northward & raining in the
afternoon cleared up two or three hours sent part of the crew
on Board the Hector stowing oil the rest employed breaking
out oil & coopersing

Friday March 14th

Comes in with northerly winds the ships crew
employed putting oil on Board of the Hector

Saturday March 15th

Light southerly winds all hands employed
putting oil on Board the Hector & breaking out & the
for hold stowing around tier &c

Sunday March 16th

These twenty four hours fresh breeze & fine clear weather
the ship Hector and watch ashore on liberty untill
nine P.M. they all broke their liberty and stayed
untill morning except George Harrington & Joseph Harris

Monday March 17th

Fine weather the ships crew employed stowing
oil on Board the Hector at daylight it was discovered
that the ship George Washington was on fire the ship
sent Prutz to her assistance & towed her on to the
flats and scuttled her and finally succeeded in getting
the fire under. Benjamin Boyd 24 hours out of
the ship without leave. Mr. Ray 3 officers & 8 men
cruisers was allowed to go on shore as the time has
expired for which they shipped

Tuesday March 18th

Comes in with the wind from the
Northward as usual and raining hard all hands
employed getting water got off 36 casks & towed
away some of it. in the main hatchway Benjamin
Boyd 48 hours away without liberty the Geo. Washington
sunk burning & supposed will be a total loss

Wednesday March 19th

This day comes in with fresh breeze from the
Northward the rain coming down as usual employed
getting off water & stowing it away Mr. Parker came
on Board this morning as 3 officers

Thursday March 20th

Thursday March 20th
light winds from N.E. and raining hard all
hands employed stowing away water allowed 150 lbs

Friday March 21st

This day comes in with fresh southerly winds
employed stowing away provisions water &c
