Friday July 11th

This day comes in with fine weather and moderate trades the ship running off N.W. Employed sending down ~~the~~ mast and ~~the~~ a new one latter part latter part got the new one aloft. Employed setting up rigging bending sails &c. Lat 127 Long 80.15

Saturday July 12th

This day comes in with moderate trades and fine weather the ship steering to the Westward middle and latter part much the same saw finbacks one man sick. Lat 116 Long 87.25

Sunday July 13th

This day comes in with fine weather and moderate trades the ship standing to the Westward at sunset were bound to the Eastward, latter part steering to the Westward saw finbacks one man off duty sick. Lat 118 Long 88.05

Monday July 14th

Comes in with fresh trades the ship steering to the Eastward by the wind middle and latter part much the same saw finbacks one man sick. Lat 113 Long 86.41 W

Tuesday July 15th

Comes in with light trades and rainy weather the ship on the Eastern tack middle part fresh breezes latter part standing to the Westward saw nothing. Lat 115 Long 86.26

Wednesday July 16th

This day comes in with moderate trades the ship standing to the Eastward at 5 P.M. saw something that looked like a whale in the water 8 miles off could not get to it before dark lay aback during the night. and next morning hauled it off the quarter 4 miles off. The run down to it and found it was a dead humpback. Whale took him along side and cut him in. latter part spoke the Bark Cornelia, one man sick. Lat Long

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Thursday July 17th

This day comes in with fine weather and moderate trades the ship standing to the Eastward employed boiling out humpback blubber. saw finbacks and porpoises the Cornelia in sight standing to the Eastward one man sick.

Friday July 18th

Comes in with fine weather the ship on the Eastern tack middle and latter part fresh trades. saw finbacks, the Cornelia's boat fast to a humpback one man off duty sick. Lat 113 N Long 85.17 W

Saturday July 19th

This day comes in with fine weather and moderate trades the ship standing to the Eastward middle and latter part much the same saw nothing employed coopersing humpback oil. a ship in sight standing to the Westward. Lat 110.05

Sunday July 20th

First part strong trade which the ship standing to the Westward middle and latter part squally. a ship in sight standing to the Eastward one man off duty sick.

Monday July 21st

This day comes in with fine weather the ship standing to the Westward spoke the Golconda of N.B. latter part steering to the N.W. saw a humpback and some kind of a whale breaching but could not tell what it was. Lat 110.05 Long 84.40

Tuesday July 22nd

First part comes in with fine weather and moderate trades the ship steering off N.W. middle and latter part much the same saw nothing latter part standing to the Eastward one man off duty sick. bent a new flying jell. and condemned the old one.
