This day comes in with moderate trades the ship working to the Southward saw nothing, the sick ones about the same

Sunday Oct 4th No Abs -

Fine weather and light trades the ship on the Western tack saw nothing John Edwards getting better, Williams about the same, Masties able to hobble round the deck a little and take his Whales

Monday Oct 5th

Comes in with fine weather and moderate trades the ship standing to the Westward middle and latter part much the same saw nothing Employed Boiling Blackfish Lat 0.49^N Long 87.52 W

Tuesday Oct 6th

This day comes in with fresh trades the ship standing to the Westward at 7 A.M. saw Whales going to the Westward, lowered three Boats at 10 A.M. the Starboard Boat struck and killed a small Whale and took him to the ship about noon. the other Boats in chase No Abs



Wednesday Oct 7th

First part moderate trades the ship in chase of Whales took the Boats up about 3 P.M. and cut in the Whales finished about 5 P.M. latter part on the Western tack saw Whales to windward carried all sail and worked the ship to windward Abingdon Island bearing about S.S.W. 25 miles

Thursday Oct 8th

Fresh trades the ship in chase of Whales at 2 P.M. lowered the Bow Boat struck and dragged and got slightly stove at 4 P.M. lowered again and chased until sunset. Middle and latter part moderate Employed Boiling at noon Abingdon bearing S. 25 miles

Friday Oct 9th

Comes in with moderate trades and clear weather the ship standing to the Westward saw porpoises, Employed Boiling finished about 12. Latter part stowing meat in the after hold at noon Abingdon bearing S.E. 25 miles

Saturday Oct 10th

Comes in with fresh breeze and squally the ship on the ship standing to the Westward, middle part standing to the Eastward at daylight, saw Whales lowered three Boats the Starboard Boat struck and lost line the Waist Boat struck and killed and got his line cut with a lance and lost the Whale, took up the Boats and stood along to the Westward

Sunday Oct 11th

Comes in with fresh trades and clear weather the ship standing to the Eastward middle and latter part much the same at 11 A.M. saw Whales going quick to windward lowered three Boats for them without success Abingdon bearing S. 18 miles East

Monday Oct 12th

Comes in with light trades at 8 A.M. saw Whales going to the N.E. lowered three Boats the Starboard Boat struck and killed a large Whale and took him to the ship about 3 P.M. commenced cutting, at sunset made all fast for the night



Tuesday Oct 13th

This day comes in with fresh trades all hands Employed cutting in finished about sunset at noon Abingdon bearing E.S.E. 25 miles

Wednesday Oct 14th

Comes in with fine weather and moderate trades the ship standing to the Eastward. Middle and latter part much the same saw nothing all hands Employed Boiling at noon Abingdon bearing E.S.E. 25 miles

Thursday Oct 15th

Fresh trades and moderate weather all hands Employed trying net oil saw nothing
