Thursday Sept 17

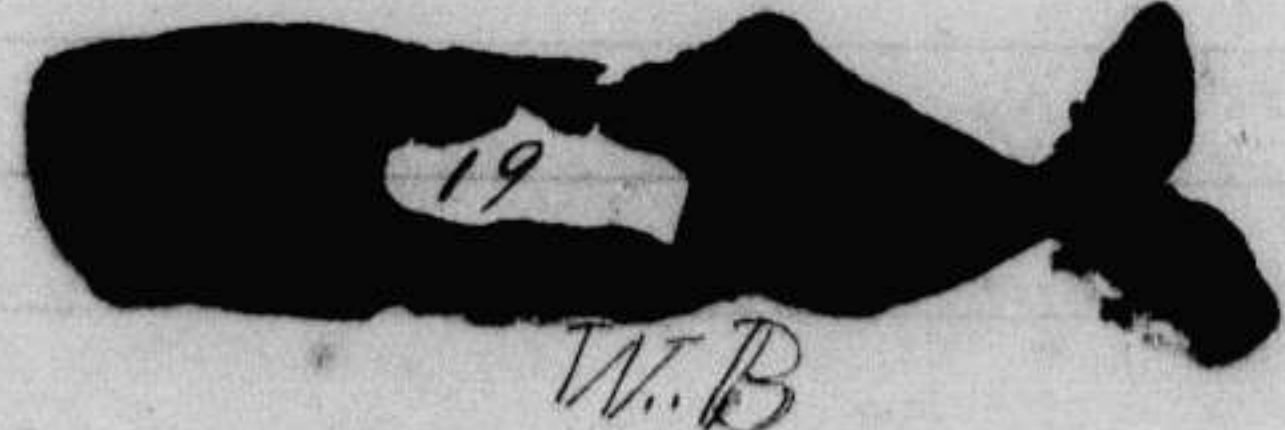
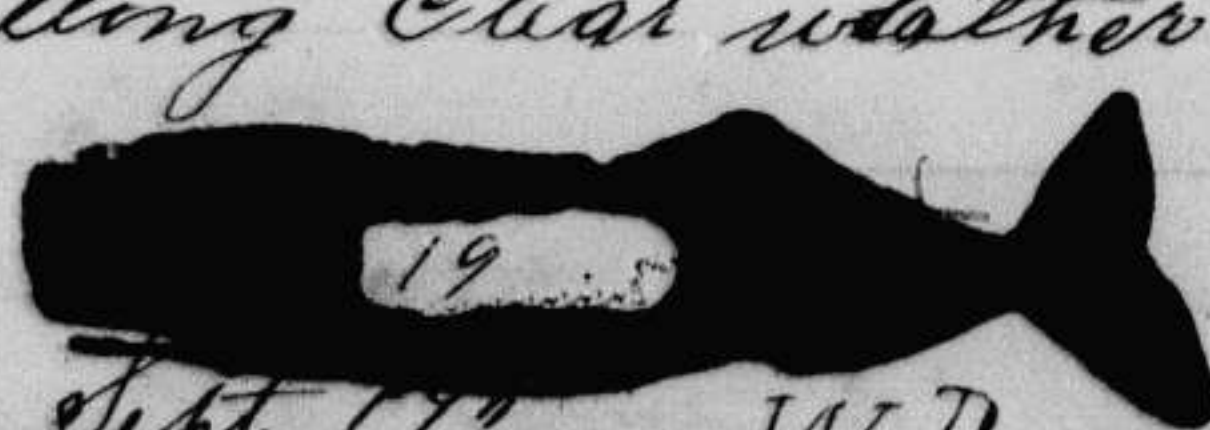
Began with very light breeze from S
 steering E.S.E. under all sail at Sundown
 took in light sail middle part the
 same latter part fresh breeze under all
 sail employed in clearing windmill at
 at 9 o'clock A.M. raised a school of
 sperm whales lowered Larboard & West
 Boat & all struck Larboard Boat got
 one whale & West Boat got two whales

Friday Sept 18th

This day Began with fresh breeze
 from S.S.W. at 4 P.M. took whales a
 long side middle part cut one whale in
 latter part finish cutting employed in
 boiling clear weather



Saturday Sept 19th

This day Began with fresh breeze from
 S.S.W. heading S.E. at 5.30 P.M. Exchange
 Longitudinal with duck B.K. Pirina Albert
 middle part employed in boiling squally
 weather latter part clear weather fresh wind

Sunday Bark Petrel September 20th 1891

This day Began with fresh wind from South
 heading S.E. under Lower Topsails clear &
 pleasant weather employed in boiling
 middle part the same latter part fresh
 boiling fresh wind steering E.S.E.
 under all sail clear weather

Patrick Halligan still very sick

Monday Sept 21st

Began with fresh breeze from South
 steering E.S.E. at night Shorten sail
 at one o'clock P.M. raised two small
 sperm whales lowered Larboard & West
 Boat & whales got killed by Boat & went
 to the windward & Boats came on board
 middle part the same latter part employed
 in stowed down oil at 11 A.M. raised
 Island of Pico on Lee bow

Tuesday Sept 22nd

This day Began with fresh wind
 from South steering E.S.E. finish
 stowed down oil middle part rain squally
 latter part cloudy weather fresh wind from
 S.S.W. steering S.E.

Wednesday Sept 23rd

This day Began with cloudy weather fresh
 wind from S.S.W. steering S.E. middle part
 holl back latter part steering S.E. at 5 o'clock
 A.M. raised Island of St. Nicholas

Patrick Halligan died Sept 23rd 1891
 he was a native of Ireland 26 years of age
 he died of Dropsy
