This day Began with strong wind from N.W. steering S by W under Lower Topsail at 5 o'clock P.M. Luffed to the wind on Port Tack heading N.E. Saw a fin backe middle part ware ship on Starboard Tack clear weather latter part strong Wind & thick fog & rain saw one fin back

Saturday Jan 16th

This day Began with strong wind from N.W. under Lower main Topsail heading N by E middle part set fore Topsail clear weather latter part moderate wind heading S.W. Apostle Island bore South Hog Island bore S.W. by S by Com

Sunday Jan 17th

This day Began with thick & rainy weather strong Wind from North heading N by E middle part clear & moderate Wind latter part strong wind from North Apostle Island in sight to the Leeward bearing S by W per

Monday Jan 18th

This day Began with strong Wind from N.W. heading N.E. under Lower Topsails one sail in sight going Eastward middle part strong Wind & heavy squalls bore wing main Topsail latter part the same

Tuesday Bark Petrel January 19th 1892

This day Began with Gale wind from N.W. heading N.W. under Lower main Topsail at 6 o'clock ware ship heading N.S.W. moderate Wind middle part Squally latter part strong Wind from N.W. under all Topsails clear weather
Lat 44° 45' South

Wednesday Jan 20th

This day Began with clear weather fresh breeze from N.W. under all Topsails at 7 o'clock wore ship heading N.E. took in upper Topsails middle part took in fore sail strong Wind from N.W. latter part thick & rainy weather

Thursday Jan 21st

This day Began with thick & rainy weather strong wind from W heading N.W. under Lower main Topsail middle part moderate Wind & clear weather latter part very light air from N.W. Employed in breaking out Beef at 9 a.m. reared two Whales to the Windward covered for them thought was Right whale but was Sulphur Bottom & Boats came on board gave 3 Gallons of rum to the crew

Friday Jan 22nd

This day Began with calm & clear weather at 2 o'clock P.M. a little Breeze from N.E. steering West under all Sails at Sundown Shorten Sails middle part Wind from N.W. & thick fog heading N.S.W. latter part the same Employed in breaking out Water Bread & Coal
