This day Begins with clear & pleasant weather strong breeze from Southward heading W by S employed in repairing main sail at night shortened Sails
middle part strong wind latter part the same under lower Topsails Bandon main sail

This day Begins with fresh wind from South Steering North at night shortened Sails & holl Back main yard Luffed to on Starboard Pack heading E.S.E. middle part ware Ship to the Westward latter part Steering North under all Topsails & main Gallant sail clear weather
Bundled up whale Bone 571 Lbs

Thursday March 10th

This day Begins with strong wind from S.W. heading W by S at night shortened Sails middle the same latter part fresh breeze Steering N.W. under Topsails clear weather

This day Begins with fresh wind from S.W. Steering N.W. under Topsails at 2.30 o'clock
P.M. raised a school of sperm whales lowered all the Boats West Boat struck at 6 o'clock
P.M. took whale & Long Sight
middle part employed in getting ready for cutting latter part strong wind from South saw a school of sperm whales going to the windward

This day Begins with strong wind from South fresh with the whale in ware Ship heading W.S.W. saw one large whale going to the windward middle part employed in boiling moderate breeze latter part strong wind heading E.S.E. under lower Topsails
