This day Began with clear & pleasant weather light breeze from Westward heading S.W. by S at night took in light Sails middle part edw. Latter part very light breeze from Westward heading South at 7 o'clock a.m. Lowered Starboard & West Boat for Black fish didn't get. fast Boats came on board fresh ball Black fish Mr. Silva are ^{well} & return to his duty again. Alfred Andrews & Rock da Silva on Starboard

Monday May 30th

This day Began with very light breeze from W heading S.S.W. at night took in main sail & light Sails sitting up Fore Top Back Stays middle part quite strong Wind took in zipper Topsails Latter part light winds employed in sitting up main Top Back Stays & Top sail Riggers

Lat 12° 30' South
Long 11° 23' East

Tuesday May 31st

This day Began with fresh wind from S.W. heading S.S.E. under all Sails at night tacked Ship heading W. by W. took in main sail & light Sails saw a fine back middle part strong winds & heavy swell. Latter part the same at 8 o'clock a.m. Spoke Bark Bertha Capt Reed went on board cloudy weather Rock da Silva & Alfred Andrews are well to day

Wednesday Bark Petrel June 1st 1892

This day Began with cloudy weather light breeze from S.W. heading W. by S in company with Bark Bertha middle part the same Latter part under all Sails steering N.E. employed in sitting up Topsails Riggers B.K. Bertha in sight cloudy weather

Thursday June 2nd

This day Began with very light breeze from S.W. steering N.E. under all Sails at night took in light Sails & luffed to the wind on Starboard Tack heading S.S.E. middle part the same Latter part under all Sails steering N.E. B.K. Bertha in sight

Lat 11° 52' South
Long 9° 39' East

Friday June 3rd 1892

This day Began with fresh breeze from S.W. steering W. at sundown took light Sails & luffed to the wind on Starboard Tack heading S.S.E. middle part light breeze Latter part the same steering N.E. under all Sails employed in breaking out Beans & Sugar Alfred Andrews & Rock da Silva are better to day

Saturday June 4th

This day Began with light breeze from S.W. steering N.E. at 3 o'clock P.M. Spoke B.K. Bertha Capt Reed went on board at night took light Sails luffed to the wind on Starboard Tack heading S.S.E. middle part the same Latter part under all Sails steering N.E. clear weather B.K. Bertha in sight. Gave sugar to the crew & Salome
