

Wednesday Back Petrel November 16th 1892

This day Begins with thick fog very light breeze from NW heading NW by E under all sail at night Shorten sail middle part fresh breeze latter part rainy weather & strong breeze from NW under topsails saw Humpbacks Bk. Hatters & one merchant ship in sight merchantmen steering about S.W. Lat 00 Long 00

Thursday Nov 17th

This day Begins with strong winds from NW under topsails at night took in upper topsail heading N.S.W. middle part moderate breeze latter part very light breeze steering N.S.W. under all sail winds from South saw Humpbacks Lat 39° 48' South Long 47° 59' West

Friday Nov 18th

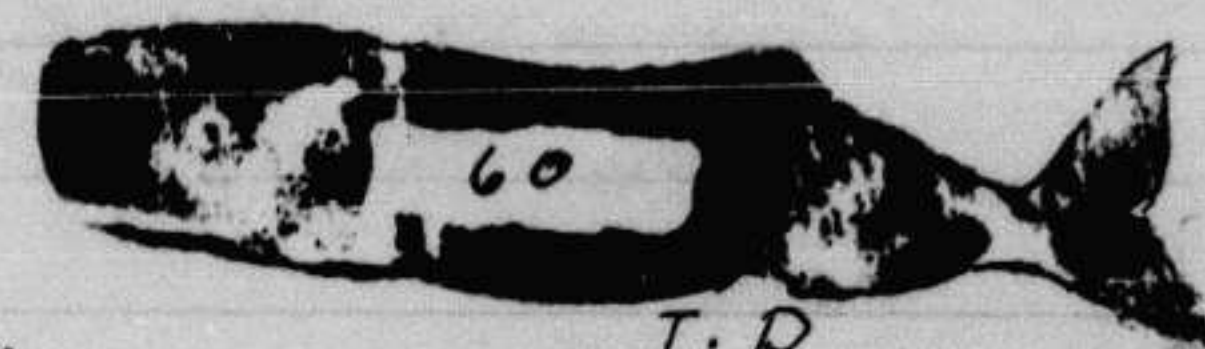
This day Begins with very light breeze from S.E. steering N.W. at night Shorten sail saw plenty Humpbacks middle part calm latter part moderate gale wind from S.E. steering N.W. by W under lower topsails Lat 39° 25' S Long 48° 28' W

Saturday Nov 19th

This day Begins with strong winds from S.E. steering NW under lower topsails at night Luff up to the winds on Port Tack heading S.W. Manuel Veira Cook sick off duty middle part very light breeze latter part calm at 11:30 o'clock A.M. rescued a large sperm whale going N.E. lowered larboard red net & Row Boat larboard Boat struck

Sunday November 20th 1892

This day Begins with calm weather at 7:30 P.M. took whale a long side Manuel Veira are well & return to his duty again middle part employed in getting ready for cutting fresh wind from NW latter part very strong wind & heavy swell employed in cutting whale saw Black fish



Monday Nov 21st

This day Begins with gale wind winds from NW & rain squalls stopped cutting goose wing main lower topsail luffing to starboard tack middle part blowing very hard latter part the same employed in cutting the whale head employed in boiling to

Tuesday Nov 22nd

This day Begins with rough weather employed in cutting saw one Right whale near to the ship middle part moderate winds in latter part strong wind fastest cut whale body employed in boiling Mr. Dominguez his arm here off duty

Wednesday Nov 23rd

This day Begins with heavy gale winds from West under goose wing main topsail stopped boiling middle part moderate latter part came on to blow hard again & heavy squalls the whale head laying out side yet wind from S.W.

Thursday Nov 24th

This day Begins with heavy gale winds from S.W. let the whale head go ware ship on starboard tack under goose wing main topsail barometer down 29 middle part blowing
