Bow Boat struck line parted but the whale all the whales went to the windward Boats came on board middle part quite right Latter part fresh breeze under Topsails

Sunday March 12th

This day Begins with fresh wind from S.W. steering S.E. at 2 o'clock Pm raised School of Sperm whales lowered all the Boats & all got fast middle part took whales along side Latter part Employed in cutting calm weather

Monday March 13th

This day Begins with very light breeze from N.W. finish cutt the whales in Employed in boiling middle part Strong Breeze from N. Latter part Blowing quite hard at 6 o'clock Am raised a School of Sperm whale on weather beam coming to the Leeward quite quick didn't not lower Employed in boiling

Tuesday March 14th

This day Begins with very rough weather Strong winds from North heading N.E. by E Employed in boiling middle part moderate Latter part Squally weather finish boiling let crew have Pickles & Mollasses

Wednesday Bark Petrel at Sea March 15th 1893

This day Begins with very light breeze from North heading West middle part Squally Latter part clear Employed in Stowed down ail 20 mate Mr. Silvia Still Sick

Thursday March 16th

This day Begins with very light air from S.E. heading East fuzed Stowed ail 55 Barrels middle part raining Latter part the same Employed in Ships duty Break out Cask Beef

Friday March 17th

This day Begins with Squally weather very light breeze from North heading N.E. by E under all Sails at Sundown wind came from S.W. steering S.E. by E middle part calm Latter part very light breeze from S.E. heading East by E under all Sails Employed in washing & fixing in side

Saturday March 18th

This day Begins with with very light breeze from S.E. heading E by N under all Sail Break out Cask Pork middle part the same Latter part fresh breeze from S.E. steering N.E. under all Sails clear & pleasant weather

Sunday March 19th

This day Begins with clear & pleasant weather fresh breeze from S.E. steering N.E. by E under all Sails middle part Squally Latter part the same Mr. Silvia Still Sick

Monday March 20th

This day Begins with rain Squally fresh Winds from S.E. steering N.E. by N under all Sails middle part Strong winds & Squally weather under Topsails & main Sallantail Latter part the same Employed in Ships duty
