March Tuesday 27

This day commences with strong winds from south west at 2 PM
am a gale blowing north east at 6 PM furl the fore and
main top sails and hoist the main. I left to the
ship to wind at 9 PM furl the fore sail the latter part strong
winds from south at 6 PM get the fore sails at 10 PM hoist
ship to south east. Lat 30-09 Long 72-00 all hands employed in ship
March Wednesday 28

This day commences with strong winds from south at 2 PM
get the fore and main top sails east out over reef cut the
top sails get the gill at 6 PM furl the gill and main top
sails and hoist the main and fore top sail at the
same time were ship to south west. the latter part strong
winds from south at 12 at night were ship to the east. at 6 PM
last emence cut the top sails get the main top gallant sail
latter part of this day moderate at 3 PM. land in sight
all hands employed in ship duty
March Thursday 29

This day commences with moderate breezes from south
at 2 PM gave a ship blowing to the east were supposed to
be the Forster at 6 PM were ship. furl the main sail. at 4 PM
get the watch & watches. hoist the fore top sail at the same
time and get the main top sail. at 12 at night were ship
to the east were at 3 PM were ship to south east the reefs
cut the top sails get the gill and main top gallant sail
the weather being thick and fog. the latter part the
jaws this day bent the cables lat 30-14 land in sight.

March Friday 30
This day commences with light wind from south west
and clear weather at 6 PM came to anchor in Tongue Bay
the North Head Baring was the south west by west. came
to with the chains. in 1/2 path overboard. all hands employed
drinking up the hole filling the ground tier with salt water
at 6 PM sent the boat on shore came with fish at 8 PM
gave a ship blowing to the north the latter part of this day
calm and clear.

March Saturday 31

This day commences with light winds from south and clear at 2 PM shift
to our storerooms. Haven the land at the same time gave a ship blowing
to the north all this day fine and pleasant. all hands employed in ship
duty. this day put on the copper that came of New York brought the iron
for the 8.1826. at 10 PM boat on shore came with one goat and pul.

April Sunday 1
This day commences with fine and pleasant the wind at south
the latter part strong winds at 4 PM gave a ship blowing north
at 8 PM one half the crew on shore on liberty at 8 PM all hands
hit the hold and one of the sailors by the named trip

April Monday 2
This day commences with strong wind at south the latter part
calm the latter part strong winds from south the day employed
sprinkling the ship and the boats. Barring the fore and main
bores. Braking out the between decks flying away from.

April Tuesday 3
This day commences with strong winds from south the latter
part moderate. light winds from north the latter part of this day
finished painting the ship and boats. at 8 PM one half of the
crew on liberty at night all hands came of except one by the
name of John Reed. Seaman.

April Wednesday 4
This day commences with moderate winds from south.
latter part from north. this day bent the fore top sail. all hands on
board except John Reed.

April Thursday 5
This day commences with strong winds from north. Middle
part from east. and clear at 8 PM got underway and went to
sea one man short. at 11 PM calm at 12 at noon light wind from south

April Friday 6
This day commences with strong winds from south at 2 PM gave a strong
blowing north at 4 PM unlashed the cables and coiled them
between decks. and stowed them down. at 6 PM furl the gill and
top gallant sail and double reef the top sails. at 8 PM furl the
the wind at south all hands employed in ship's duty lat 29-28 Long 72-19
