May at 2 P.M. bore ship to the North East. at 6 A.M. got all sail bore ship to the West North West this day put the wheel for steaming. At latter part brisk trades. and cloudy Allhand imployed in ship duty lat 5:06 land in sight.

May Tuesday 15

This day commences with strong trades at 3 P.M. gave a brig clearing to North East. at 4 P.M. gave a school of black fish at Vint took in the top gallant sails and gave left to the North East. the young Phoenix in company. at 6 A.M. got the maintop gallant sail. strong wind at 1 P.M. gave a large school of 4 sperm whales. at the same time got the gib at 6 A.M. heard the boats knock one and lost him. Day Wind in sight.

May Wednesday 16

This day commences with brisk trades at 2 P.M. gave a school of sperm whales. toward and caught nothing the young Phoenix caught one. at 4 P.M. gave a brig steaming North at 6 P.M. gave the top gallant sail and tack ship to the South West. at 6 A.M. tack ship to the North East at the same time. school sail. gave black fish at 10 A.M. bore ship to the South West gave the young Phoenix Allhand imployed in ship duty lat 5:28 Long 82:20

May Thursday 17

This day commences with strong winds and cloudy at 4 P.M. gave black fish. at the same time gave the young Phoenix to the Windward steaming Northeast. at 6 A.M. took in the top gallant sails and bore ship to the North East. at 6 A.M. gave a sail steaming to the North at 8 A.M. the young Phoenix at 11 A.M. gave a sail steaming South West the latter part light wind and cloudy Allhand imployed in ship duty lat 5:28 land in sight.

May Friday 18

This day commences with light wind and cloudy at 6 P.M. fired the light sails gave a great many black fish - steaming to the South West the young Phoenix in sight at 6 A.M. got the gib and maintop gallant sail gave nothing all hands inspecting the West Boats lat 5:28 Long 82:40

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May Saturday 19

This day commences with moderate trades and cloudy at 8 P.M. the Russell of New Bedford. at 9 A.M. fired the maintop gallant sail at the same time hove the fore sail up steaming North East the Russell 23 Months out with 2050 barrels. home home. all sail at 6 A.M. got all sail. allhand imployed in ship duty lat 5:34 land in sight.

May Sunday 20

This day commences with light trades and cloudy at 2 P.M. tack ship to the South West at Night took in the top gallant sails at the same time gave black fish. at 6 A.M. tack ship to the North East at the same time got the maintop gallant sail and Main sail lat 5:52 Long 82:40

May Monday 21

This day commences with strong wind and clear at 6 P.M. fired the top gallant sails at 8 P.M. bore ship to the South West at 6 A.M. got the fore sail and maintop gallant sail at the same time tack ship to the North East. at 8 A.M. got the fore top gallant sail. at the same time gave a fin back and black fish Allhand imployed in firing the cutting tacks. lat 5:42 Long 82:10

May Tuesday 22

This day commences with brisk trades and cloudy at 6 P.M. fired the fore and maintop gallant sail at 6 A.M. tack ship to North East at 8 A.M. gave a large whale got the top gallant sails at the same time. Allhand imployed in bracing up the after hole lat 5:28 land in sight.

May Wednesday 23

This day commences with light wind at 6 P.M. fired the top gallant sails took in the flying gib hove the fore sail up the Russell in sight. at 6 A.M. got the top gallant sails foremast. at 8 A.M. gave 2 ship. in sight Allhand imployed in bracing up the after hole lat 5:48 land in sight

May Thursday 24

This day commences with light wind and clear at 6 P.M. took in the top gallant sails at 8 P.M. bore ship to South West the young Phoenix in company. at 2 A.M. bore ship to the North East. gave black fish and hump backs Allhand imployed in ship duty lat 5:20 land in sight.
