July

Thursday 5

This day Commences with light wind and cloudy at 2 P.M. hauls ship to the fourth west at 6 P.M. furl the top gallant sails and flying jib at 10 P.M. hauls ship to the Eastward the Independence in company at 6 P.M. hauls ship to the fourth west. Latter part light wind. All hands employed in repairing sails lat 3-30 long 82-20

July

Friday 6

This day Commences with strong wind and cloudy at 6 P.M. hauls ship to the Eastward at 6 P.M. hauls the land at the same time hauls ship to the fourth west. All hands employed in repairing sails lat 3-43 long 82-20. Independence in company

July

Saturday 7

Thursday Commences with strong wind and cloudy at night hauls to the fourth west the Independence in company at 2 P.M. hauls ship to the fourth East at 6 P.M. get the Main top gallant sail the latter part light wind and cloudy. All hands employed in carrying ship's duty. lat 3-38 long 82-15

July

Sunday 8

This day Commences with light wind and cloudy. Saw Black fish at 6 P.M. furl the fore top gallant sail all this day light wind and clear lat 3-41 long in sight

July

Monday 9

This day light wind and cloudy at 4 P.M. saw a whole of Whales at 5 P.M. hauls to and caught one L 25 at 10 P.M. put him in and commence boiling. Latter part light wind and clear lat 3-25 long in sight

July

Tuesday 10

This day Commences with light wind and clear. all this day hauling fourth west the Middle part the day strong wind and cloudy at 4 P.M. hauls ship to the Eastward. All hands employed in boiling lat 3-45 long 82-40

July

Wednesday 11

This day Commences with strong wind and clear. hauls ship at 4 P.M. at 8 P.M. hauls ship to the fourth west. All this day moderate breezes and clear. saw fin backs lat 3-40 long 82-40

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July

Thursday 12

This day Commences with light wind and clear at 2 P.M. hauls ship to the fourth west. and the wind stronger all this day strong wind and clear at 4 P.M. hauls all hand and double reef the top sails and hoist the gill on main ship at the same time at 5 P.M. get the Main top gallant sail lat 2-52 long 82-20

July

Friday 13

This day Commences with moderate wind. Cloudy at 6 P.M. hauls ship at 9 P.M. furl the Main top gallant sail. more wind at 6 P.M. get all sail at 11 P.M. saw a whole of whales. lat 2-24 long in sight

July

Saturday 14

This day Commences with light wind all sail set at 2 P.M. saw a whole of whales toward the three boats and killed 4 coming to the ships. Keeping out of sight lat 2-11 at night furl the light sails. headed to the fourth west. at 12 at night hauls ship to the East at 4 P.M. hauls the Main yard back at 6 P.M. hauls ship to the fourth west all sail set. Saw Black fish. Saw nothing of the Dead whales lat 2-42 long 82-35

July

Sunday 15

This day Commences with strong wind and cloudy at 6 P.M. hauls ship to the fourth west. at 10 P.M. furl the Main top gallant sail. at 1 P.M. hauls ship to the Eastward get the Main top gallant at the same time at 10 P.M. furl the Main top gallant sail. All this strong wind lat 3-04 long 83-40

July

Monday 16

This day Commences with strong wind and cloudy headed to the Eastward under gingle kept the top sails. the Middle part strong wind and cloudy. All hands employed filling water in the bar hole and shifting iron into the run. at 8 P.M. hauls ship to the fourth west lat 3-05 long 83-10

July

Tuesday 17

This day Commences with strong wind and cloudy at 2 P.M. hauls ship to the East fourth East. at 6 P.M. more moderate get the Main top gallant sail. at 2 P.M. furl the main top gallant sail. hauls ship to fourth west at 6 P.M. get the Main top gallant sail. at 10 P.M. hauls ship to 8 P.M. All hands employed in repairing sails lat 3-20 long 82-40
