All hand employed stowing the oil. Lat 42 57 Long 79 45

November Tuesday 20

This Day Commences with light wind and pleasant weather at 1 P.M. Jan a ship steaming further East. took ship to the Eastward at the Middle part light wind at 5 P.M. took ship to further West. All hand employed in stowing down oil. Latter part moderate wind Jan a ship to further West Lat 42 49 Long 82 40

November Wednesday 21

This Day Commences with fresh wind at 6 P.M. finished stowing down at the same time took ship to the Eastward. furl'd the fore top gallant sail and flying gills. at 2 P.M. took ship to further West. Latter part light wind. Lat 42 10 Long 83 50

November Thursday 22

This Day Commences with light wind at 2 P.M. unboard the fore sail. gills. Main top gallant sail. at 6 P.M. took ship to Eastward at 6 P.M. got all sail all hand employed in repairing sails. Latter part of the Day light wind and pleasant Lat 50 10 Long 83 20

November Friday 23

This Day Commences with light wind all sail got at 6 P.M. furl'd the fore and Main top gallant sails. at 6 P.M. got all sail at down took ship to the Eastward all hand employed in ship duty Lat 51 10 Long 83 40

November Saturday 24

This Day Commences with light wind all sail got at 4 P.M. spoke the ship Swift of New Bedford 6 Months out 500 bbls. at 6 P.M. furl'd the light sails at 2 P.M. took ship to further West at 6 P.M. got the light sails. Pumpin back at 11 P.M. took ship to the Eastward Lat 52 28 Long 83 25

This Day Commences with light wind and pleasant all sail got at 4 P.M. Jan a sail. Steaming to the Eastward at 6 P.M. fresh wind. furl'd the fore and Main top gallant sails. furl'd the Main top sail. at 11 P.M. took ship to further West. at 6 P.M. East the kept out the Main top sail. got the light sails at 11 P.M. took ship to the Eastward Lat 52 21 Long 82 50

November Monday 26

This Day Commences with light wind all sail got at 3 P.M. Jan a sail steaming to the Eastward. at 6 P.M. furl'd the flying gills and Main top gallant sail. at 12 at light took ship to the further West. at 6 P.M. got all sail. at the same time Jan a ship steaming further West. all hands employed in repairing sail and ship duty Lat 52 24 Long 83 00

November Tuesday 27

This Day Commences with light wind and clear weather all sail got at 4 P.M. took ship to the Eastward. this Day Jan a great quantity yellow and head water. at 6 P.M. furl'd the flying gills and Main top gallant sail. at 4 P.M. took ship to the further. got all sail at daylight. Jan a brig steaming to the Eastward Jan a ship the same. all hand employed in ship duty Lat 50 00 Long 87 50

November Wednesday 28

This Day Commences with light wind all sail got at 4 P.M. spoke the young George & Susan & Martha out 450 bbls. at 6 P.M. furl'd the fore and Main top gallant sail flying gills. headed to the Eastward at 2 P.M. took ship to further West. at 6 P.M. got all sail. Latter part of this Day light wind and pleasant weather all employed in ship duty this Day. got up the Blacksmiths forge. Lat 6 00 Long 81 35

November Thursday 29

This Day Commences with light wind clear weather at down took ship to the Eastward at 4 P.M. Jan a hump back at light furl'd the light sails George & Susan in sight at 6 P.M. got all sail Jan a Briggs and the same Lat 53 39 Long 81 35
