

Ship Phoebe Ann New Bedford 1828

February

Thursday 14

This day commences with fresh wind all sail set at noon left of South West. at 6 AM took in sail further light. left to the wind South East. gave him backe responses. at 6 AM set all sail at the same time left of West by South at 8 AM gave the Congress 19 Mantees out 1400 Barrels. all hand imployed in ships duty Lat 00 18 Miles North Longi 116 40 West.

February

Friday 15

This day commences with light wind and pleasant all sails at 6 AM gave a shole of Whales at night furl'd the light sail hearing South. at 6 AM set all sail now ship to North East light wind and pleasant the Congress in sight all hand imployed in ships duty Lat 00 11 North Longi 116 45 West.

February

Saturday 16

This day commences with light wind and pleasant all sail set at 6 AM furl'd the light sails. at the same time now ship to South West. at 6 AM set all sail at 10 AM gave a shole Whales toward caught nothing. the Whales going quick to the South East. all hand imployed in ships duty Lat 00 24 North Longi 117 05

February

Sunday 17

This day commences with light wind and pleasant all sail set hearing South West at 6 AM furl'd the light sails and single reef'd the top sails. at 6 AM set all sail. the latter part of this day light squalls of rain. Lat 00 06 Miles North Longi 117 30

February

Monday 18

This day commences with light wind and pleasant all sail set hearing South West. at 6 AM furl'd the light sail single reef'd the top sails. the middle part light wind at 6 AM set all sail hearing N. South. W. at 10 AM gave a shole of Whales at noon toward Lat 00 11 Miles South Longi 118 40 West 43

February

Tuesday 19

This day commences with light wind and pleasant. in chase of Whales 4 PM took 2 a large side. caught cut one leg by the other. Reached to the North East. at 8 AM call all hand commencing cutting at 8 AM finish'd cutting got sail now ship to South West and commencing hoisting Lat 00 08 Miles South Longi 119 45

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Wednesday 20

This day commences with light wind at 6 AM took in sail for the night. hearing South West. the middle part light wind pleasant at noon finish'd hoisting. at 8 AM ship to the North East. Lat 00 31 South Longi 120 30

February

Thursday 21

This day commences with light wind at 6 AM strong wind took sail for the night at 8 AM spoke the ship Commodore Decatur of New Bedford. 8 Mantees out 8-50 Barrels. hearing North East. the latter part of this day light wind all sail set Lat 00 31 Miles North Longi 120 40

February

Friday 22

This day commences with light wind and pleasant at noon took up to South West at 6 AM furl'd of Rain Double Reef'd the top sails at 6 AM set all sail hearing South West all hand imployed in ships duty Lat 00 55 Miles South Longi 120 55 West.

February

Saturday 23

This day commences with fresh wind all sail set at 6 PM furl'd the light sails hearing South West. at 8 PM spoke the ship Congress of Manchester at 8 PM heard South South West at 6 PM strong wind all hand imployed in hoisting down Lat 4 24 Longi 120 45

February

Sunday 24

This day commences with strong wind and pleasant at 8 PM finish'd hoisting down. at the same time gave a shole of Whales going to the Westward. Main sail furl'd for them. Night coming on. put them took in sail left the ship to South South West. the middle strong wind the latter part the same Lat 3 49 South Longi 120 45

February

Monday 25

This day commences with strong wind hearing South West at 6 AM furl'd the light sails. Double Reef'd the Main top sail. at 6 AM squally attended with Rain all hand imployed in ships duty Lat 5 28 South Longi 120 40 West

February

Tuesday 26

This day commences with strong wind squally with light Rain hearing South under Double Reef'd top sails. the middle part the same the latter part more moderate got the Main sail all hand imployed in ships duty Lat 4 02 South Longi 121 50

February

Wednesday 27

This day commences with light wind and pleasant at 6 AM
