at 1 PM Vard ship to East the wind from S. East all hands employed in boiling the fore and Mizzen top sails put the Cloast Reef Main top and fore sail. put the latter part strong wind from south East at 2 PM put the fore sail all hands employed in boiling at 3 PM Long 178° 30' East

June Sunday 14

This Day Commences with strong wind from N. to N. E. at 6 PM the wind changed to W. N. West. put the fore sail at 6 PM put the fore sail. Light wind and heavy sea running. Boiling at midnight the wind changed to S. East at midnight with rain. put the fore top gallant yard at 11 PM for sail Boiling. Lat Long 178° 10' East

June Monday 15

This Day Commences with strong wind attended with rain at 2 PM Vard ship to S. East. the wind at East. at 3 PM put the fore sail at 3 PM put the fore sail. the wind from East. this day improvement in clearing down. Lat 31° 09' North Long 178° 50' West

July 12 of Tuesday 1

This Day Commences with strong wind from south East. Healed to S. West. at 6 PM put the fore sail. at 8 PM put the fore sail at 9 PM saw a number of Whales going to south East put the top sail Cloast Reef at 10 PM. saw a number of Whales. the Harpoon and lost him. all hands employed in clearing down Lat. 30° 15' North Long 178° 15' West

July Wednesday 2

This Day Commences with strong wind from south East and Cloudy. at 7 PM put the fore and Mizzen top sails fore sail. Healed to S. West. at 8 PM finish clearing down. at 9 PM light wind from S. East put all sail. Heavy W. N. West. saw 3 Whales. all hands employed in washing Lat 31° 0' North Long 177° 20' East for observation.

July 13 9 Thursday 3

This Day Commences with light wind from S. East at noon Vard ship to S. East all sail put. Light wind and pleasant at 4 PM saw a large Whale going south West at 5 PM saw a small Whale. Came and passed took him sail for the night. at Day Light put all sail. clear to the East wind light wind from south and pleasant at 10 PM took ship to south West saw a number of small fish the watch employed in ship duty Lat 31° 03' North Long 178° 10' East for observation.

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July Friday 4

This Day Commences with light wind from S. East all sail put. clearing south West. at 4 PM took him sail for the night lay to the south West. at Day Light put the top sails single reef. Light wind and squally with Rain. at 10 PM Vard ship to south East. put the Main top gallant sail saw a number of small fish Lat 30° 5' North Long 177° 35' East

July Saturday 5

This Day Commences with light wind from south East. clear North East with single reef top sail main top gallant sail. at 2 PM. put the Mizzen top gallant Mast Down. at 4 PM put the fore and Mizzen top sail fore sail and gill. Cloast Reef the Main top sail lift the to the wind to the East. at Day Light put all sail kept off North West the watch employed in ship duty Lat 31° 4' North Long 176° 44' East

July Sunday 6 10 520 54

This Day Commences with light wind from S. East and pleasant. clearing south West. all sail put at 3 PM. saw a number of Whales. saw a number of Whales. killed one took him a large piece lay to the North under Cloast Reef main top sail. this Day put the fore top gallant mast Down. at Day Light. Commenced cutting at 8 PM. finish. Vard ship to south West put the top sails single reef and Mizzen top gallant sail Lat. 32° 22' North Long 176° 45' East.

July 11 Monday 7

This Day Commences with fresh wind from south East. with single reef top sails and main top gallant sail put at 1 PM Vard ship to North West. at 4 PM commenced boiling. at 4 PM put the top sails lift to the S. East. at Day Light put the top sails double reef at 10 PM strong wind from S. East. at 8 PM saw Whales. all hands employed in boiling Lat 32° 50' Long 178° 06' East.

July Tuesday 8

This Day Commences with strong wind from S. East clear by the wind to the East wind at 3 PM Vard ship to S. West at night put the top sails. at 4 PM finish boiling and put the top sails strong wind from south East. Lat 32° 29' North Long 177° 58' East

July Wednesday 9

This Day Commences with light wind from south S. East clearing south West. at night put the top sails. at Day Light put all sail
