August Wednesday 13

These 24 hours commences with moderate wind from East all sail set
steering N.E. Middle part of light wind and pleasant all sail set
part do all hand employed in breaking up the Main hatchway and
steering of the Bottom Docks lat 31:28 North Longi 146:35 West

August Thursday 14
These 24 hours commences with light wind from East steering N.E.
all sail set at 4 P.M. tack ship to South the wind E. East. Middle
part light wind and pleasant all set at 4 P.M. Rear ship to West
the watch employed in ship. Do 4 P.M. 12 South Longi 146:30 West obs.

August Friday 15 23 20.5
These 24 hours commences with light wind from East steering
N.E. East all sail set. at 4 P.M. changed the fore top sails. the mid-
part light squally rain and wind. fore the Main top gallant
sail at day light set it a gain. at 8 P.M. saw a shoal of whales at 9 P.M.
filled 2 at noon took them a large piece. the whales going South
West. lat 32:10 Longi 146:05 West.

August Saturday 16 25 24 24
These 24 hours commences with strong wind and squally at noon saw
shoal of whales going South West struck and killed one. at the
same time lost one from Longi side the fluke rope parted
at 2 P.M. took another of large piece commencing cutting the
small one at 6 P.M. finished cutting the fore one part the cable
on the large one fore the top sail sag to West at day
light commencing cutting strong wind and squally at 8 P.M. finished
cutting. lost the case. lat 32:29 North Longi 146:30 West.

August Sunday 17
This day commences with strong wind and squally from the
South East. at 8 P.M. finished cutting lost the case 6 P.M. commencing
sailing Midnight strong squally wind Main thermidem and
lightning. Latter part more moderate and pleasant all hand
employed in sailing the wind part East lat 32:56 North Longi 146:22 West

August Monday 18
This day commences with light wind from South East and Plea-
sant. steering E. S. E. Closest Reef top sails and gill. Latter part
more moderate set the top sails jingle kept the wind at South

August Tuesday 19 25 69

These 24 hours commences with light wind and pleasant jingle kept top
sails set steering N.E. by East the wind at South East by East employed in
sailing at 8 P.M. finished sailing at 6 P.M. saw a large whale going
to South East. the 12 part fresh wind from S.E. East. Latter part light wind
pleasant this day finished steering the Main hatchway lat 33:55
North Longi 147:11 West.

August Wednesday 20
These 24 hours commences with light wind and pleasant the wind
from South East by South. steering by the wind to East by South with
jingle kept top sails set. at daylight set the Main top gallant sail
the wind at South East at 9 P.M. set the Main sail all hand em-
ployed in steering down. lat 34:26 North Longi 148:10

August Thursday 21
These 24 hours commences with light wind from S. South East all
sail set steering N.E. East at 4 P.M. tack ship to South at 8 P.M. finished
steering down. saw breacher. Latter part light wind from East. and Pleasant
steering South the watch employed in repairing sail lat 35:47 North
August Friday 22 Longi 142:40 West
These 24 hours commences with light wind from East and Pleasant
steering South South East. all sail set. Middle part light wind and
Pleasant. Latter part strong wind from East at 9 P.M. hauled the
Main top gallant sail. this day found the flings of the Main
yard parted lat 32:42 North Longi 142:10 West

August Saturday 23
These 24 hours commences with strong wind from East and Pleasant
fired the flings to the Main yard at 6 P.M. doubled built the fore
top sail fore the Main sail. steering N.E. East. Latter part strong
wind and squally attended with rain fore the fore Closest Reef the top sail
at 11 P.M. set the Main sail lat 31:53 North Longi 143:00 West

August Sunday 24
These 24 hours commences with strong wind from E. East. Closest
Reef top sail and Main sail set. at 2 P.M. but the Book House about
killed a dog. tack ship to South East by North. at Midnight fore the
