January Sunday 11

These 24 Hours Commences with Moderate wind from N.E. to North at 6 P.M. Double the top sails furled the Main top gallant sail rolled the Main sail up. Steaming E. by South at 11 P.M. Drove ship to North West at 2 P.M. Drove ship to E. by East at Daylight set all sail at 10 A.M. The breeze fresh of wind from North East. furled the top gallant sails giv and Main sail. at 11 P.M. set the Main sail and gave her good way kind Lat. 10-49 fourth Long 153-06 West.

January Monday 12 Lat 10-48 Long 153-06 West

These 24 Hours Commences with Light wind from North East. at 8 P.M. Stronger wind and squally with Rain. the wind Variable at 6 P.M. furled the Main sail. Closest kept the top sails the wind from North East. at 10 P.M. squall furled the giv. Sharp Light tiring from South East. at Daylight let down out the top sails set the Main sail Main top gallant sail. at the same time gave her flint. Drove ship South by East. Dist 12 Miles. Lat of the Land 11-28 fourth Long 152-6 West at from the Land bearing West. Dist 12 M. Lat 11-29 fourth Long 151-54 West

January Tuesday 13

These 24 Hours Commences with Light wind from East. all sails set Steaming by the wind. at 4 P.M. furled the fore and Mizzen top gallant sails at Daylight set all sail at 10 A.M. furled the fore and Mizzen top gallant sails at Noon gave her way to the North East. Wind from E. by East

January Wednesday 14 Lat 12-42 fourth Long 151-55 West

These 24 Hours Commences with Stronger wind from E. by East. Steaming fourth at 1 P.M. tack ship to North East. at 4 P.M. bent the fore Main top sail at 6 P.M. furled the Main top gallant sail. of single kept the top sails. Middle part Light wind Variable tack ship occasionally latter part Light wind squally with Rain Lat 12-22 fourth Long 151-24 West

January Thursday 15

These 24 Hours Commences with Light wind and Variable tack ship occasionally Light squalls with Rain. and thunder and high tiring the wind from E. by East. to E. by East. the Middle part wind from E. by East latter part calm. the watching cloud in the sky Lat 12-32 fourth Long 151-19 West

January Friday 16

These 24 Hours Commences with Calm at 2 P.M. Light squall of rain from N.E. at 6 P.M. Calm. at 9 P.M. Light wind from North with

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Rain at 10 P.M. the wind from West. at 11 P.M. set all sail. this day bent flying giv. Middle part Light wind from West North West attended with Rain. at 5 P.M. Stronger wind and heavy Rain from N.E. furled the fore and Mizzen top sails and fore sail sent the fore and Mizzen top gallant gear to Down Closest kept the Main top sail Lat 13-33 fourth Long 150-49 West.

January Saturday 17

These 24 Hours Commences with Stronger wind from N.E. the ship bent to the wind at 2 P.M. kept of East by South set the fore sail at 3 P.M. kept of South East by East. at 4 P.M. shifted to the E. by East. Stronger wind Light Rain latter part of the Mizzen top Mast Back stays. and put it up again. Middle part More moderate at Daylight set all sail. at 8 P.M. set the fore top Mast Steaming sail sent the fore and Mizzen top gallant gear to up the wind North East Coast fourth by East. Lat 14-32 fourth Long 150-00

January Sunday 18

These 24 Hours Commences with Light wind from North East and blew out all sail set Steaming fourth by East. at 1 P.M. furled the fore and Mizzen top gallant sails took in the Steaming sail rolled the fore sail up shifted the wind to the Eastward at 2 P.M. kept of fourth by East. set all sail. Light squalls of Wind and Rain. Lat 16-31 fourth Long 149-45 West.

January Monday 19

These 24 Hours Commences with Light squalls of Wind and Rain the wind Variable from East to North at 6 P.M. Closest kept the top sails Lat to the wind to fourth by East. the wind at East by South. at 6 P.M. saw Keahine Bairy Keomays West by fourth 48 Miles. Distances at 8 P.M. kept of set all sail. Steaming by fourth Lat 16-42 Lat Long 150-48 West

January Tuesday 20

These 24 Hours Commences with Light wind from East. all sail set at 6 P.M. sent the boat on shore at 4 P.M. came of tack ship of and on the shore. at 8 P.M. came to anchor sent Down the top gallant gear

January Wednesday 21

These 24 Hours Commences with Stronger squalls of Wind and Rain at 3 P.M. kept in to the inner Harbour came to anchor with the. Close Middle part Light squalls of Rain. the latter part. Do. imploding Coping the Bottom Docks oil.

January Thursday 22

These 24 Hours Commences with Light wind squalls of Rain. Middle part
