 people employed at various jobs

Remarks Onboard Friday July 13th 1847  
 These 24 hours commences with light breezes  
 from W.W. steering E by E all sail set pleasant  
 after supper landed the boats for exercise  
 boats crewed  
 middle part cloudy with heavy fog

ends with calm employed setting up rigging making  
 potatoes

Remarks Onboard Saturday July 14th 1847  
 These 24 hours commences with light airs from W.W.  
 & pleasant all sail set steering E by E  
 setting up main rigging & fore and aft stays  
 broke out water  
 middle part cloudy with light airs

latter part calm ends with huffling airs  
 course V.E. by E.  
 brock two Bbs of meat one beef one pork  
 Long 39.31 Lett 39.09.27

Remarks Onboard Sunday July 15th 1847  
 These 24 hours commences with light huffling  
 airs from North to West & passing clouds steering V.E. by E.  
 at dusk moderate breezes from W.W.

middle part the same course V.E. by E.

latter part fine breezes & clear weather  
 saw no whales

Remarks Onboard Monday July 16th 1847  
 These 24 hours commences with fine fresh breezes from  
 West & clear weather all sail set steering V.E. by E.  
 saw nothing so far

middle part the same

steering V.E. by E & E  
 ends with fine breezes from W.W.
