

Remarks Onboard Tuesday July 20th 1847

These 24 hours commences with fine breezes from N.W. all sail set steering S.E. & E. clear weather with a few clouds along for land 3/4 of N.W. spoke an English Bark - Halpho of London Bound to Port

middle part more moderate

latter part the same people employed at various jobs this morn

Long 31° 25' N.

Lat 38° 29' S

Remarks Onboard Wednesday July 21st 1847

These 24 hours commences with moderate breezes from N.W. & clear weather steering S.E. & E. all sail set saw porpoises

middle part fresh breezes with flying clouds from N.W. at 5 P.M. saw Fogel bearing E by S 10 miles per compass Dist 10 miles steering E by S

latter part more moderate spoke Bay Thoresmian of West port 12 months out 1/20 Bobs Sparrow at 9 capt went ashore at the town this morn

Long 30° 40' N

Lat 39° 03'

Remarks Onboard Thursday July 22nd 1847

These 24 hours begins with fine breezes from N.W. laying off an on Fogel at 2 P.M. recruits came off at dusk capt came on board. bore up for sea with late air from N.W. all sail set

middle part air shifted to South employed working at the passage between Fogel & Pico at daylight Fogel bearing N.E. 10 miles saw 3 ship going ends with moderate breezes from N.W. employed working to windward

Land in sight

Lat 39° 03'

Remarks Onboard Friday July 23rd 1847

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from N.W. at 2 P.M. took 21d of from Pico heading N.W. & sent took in top gallant sails & fly jib lost sight of the land bearing N.W. employed picking up arms & baggage put up with middle part the same heading N.W. & cloudy at day light raining

latter part more moderate employed picking up arms & baggage put up with 21d's & bags of other goods Pico & Fogel in sight bearing N.E. 40 miles Dist 37 miles

Remarks Onboard Saturday July 24th 1847

These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from N.W. steering N.W. all sail set clear weather at dusk lost sight of the land bearing N.E. & other compass

middle part the same steering N.W.

latter part more moderate employed breaking out water & bread getting lumber from between decks

Long 26° 40' N

Lat 36° 22' S

Remarks Onboard Sunday July 25th 1847

These 24 hours commences with light breezes from N.W. all sail set steering N.W. clear weather at 6 P.M. lowered the boats for exercise at 8 P.M. at night saw 3 boats bound for the N.W. purpose

middle part the same with light air from the South

latter part passing squalls of rain & fog saw nothing

Long 26° 20' N

Lat 35° 27' S
