These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from
East clear weather clearing South the W all sail set
saw 2 black steering NW by N

middle part fresh breezes & flying clouds
took the N & E trades yesterday

ends with fresh breezes & heavy smoky weather
steering South the W all sail set saw 2 black

Remarks On board Monday August 2nd 1847
These 24 hours commences with fresh breezes from NE
clear weather all sail set steering South the W

middle part the same

ends with strong N & E trades saw 2 black
people employed but various jobs broke out another
made minding tops & the lee bench this ends

wounded man doing well

Remarks On board Tuesday August 3rd 1847
These 24 hours begins with strong N & E trades &
flying clouds steering NE the W all sail set at 1 PM
loaded 1 boat caught a turtle dressed him
saw a sail steering to NW
middle part the same

ends with strong breezes from North brought 2 barrels
of meat made turtle but people employed dressing gear
wounded man doing well

Long for shore 23 30 W Lat by B 18 43

Remarks On board Wednesday August 4th 1847
These twenty four hours begins with strong breezes
from North steering NE the W all sail set at
saw 1 black fish did not lower for them struck a
porpoise heavy passing clouds

middle part the at 1 PM have no heading ESE
main & all sail set at daylight bore up at 1 PM &
made sail winds North
ends with moderate breezes & smoky horizon
NE point of the rocks bearing NW the compass dit
5 miles Lat at day by B 18 32 N

Remarks On board Thursday August 5th 1847
These 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from
NE pleasant with smoky horizon hauled up at 1 PM
at noon at 1 PM past 12 PM saw breachers bearing NE
miles & proved to be the NE point of St Nicolas one
of the Capt. D. Lewis islands ran down to leeward
lower for blackfish to 4 PM bore up at 4 PM
all sail set middle part moderate

at daylight calm ends with fresh breezes
from NE hauled our wind heading NE by N
at 11 PM saw the island of Fogo bearing NE 12 miles
west wind east more to NE within for the land breeze
at 1 PM Long East End of Fogo Lat by B 13 15 06

Remarks On board Friday August 6th 1847
These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from SE at 1 PM
for the land within one mile saw 2 places to land ran down
along shore 3 or 4 miles to NW saw a schooner off shore
bound North by 10 4 AM calm current setting ESE at
past 1 PM middle of the land bearing NE 12 miles off ship bearing
NE by N middle calm drifting off shore to the NE
at daylight 4 PM miles off shore light air from
NW shore in shore Capt. D. Lewis went on shore could not
trade 1 boat lowered for blackfish 1 boat struck
one holding in 2 minutes 1 blackfish boat came off at 1 PM
boat & compass
ends with calm current setting along shore Easterly
Long Fogo Lat 4 miles off shore
