

Remarks Onboard Friday August 13th 1847

These 24 hours begins with calm & pleasant several
sail in sight. Bound to the N. at 10 AM light air
from W. S. blowing

middle part fine breezes from N. W. S. steering
by E. all sail set

Ends with severe rain & light air caught 25
barrels of rain water saw 2 black birds bound N. W.

Long per hour 23 15 m Lat by Bar 40-30-25

Remarks Onboard Saturday August 14th 1847

These 24 hours begins with light air from
N. W. S. steering by E. rainy weather at dusk
boarded an English Bark from Chiric bound to
Liverpool the vessel N. Thompson master put some
letters on board of her
middle part moderate breezes from N. W. S.
ship heading by E

Ends with light breezes from N. E. at 11 PM saw Blackfish
lowered the boat cast a net struck both 2 & a large side &
one short ship head E. E. and looked at the head but
it below

Remarks Onboard Sunday August 15th 1847

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from South
ship heading E. E. at 10 AM people employed clearing away
Blackfish clear weather
middle part calm

latter part light air from N. W. S.
several sails in sight

Long 22-40 W Lat by Bar 10-20

Remarks Onboard Monday August 16th 1847

These 24 hours begins with light air from South steering
South at 9 AM had a severe squall from W. E.
at 4 saw Blackfish lower for them struck one but him
came on board bore up South

middle part light baffling air
Copper taken such this morning & gone below

Ends with light breezes from N. W. S. pleasant
employed hauling Blackfish blubber turned up 1, 1/2 lbs.
several sail in sight exchanged colors with 2 of them
proved to be English

Long 21-50 W

Lat 9-45 South

Remarks Onboard Tuesday August 17th 1847

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from N. W. S.
pleasant all sail set course South 2 black birds in sight
steering the same this day broke out bread & butter
at dusk but no wind ship heading by E. S.
middle part fine breezes from N. W. S. steering South

Ends the same people employed making muck
this day killed 8 sheep

Copper off duty very rich
Long 21-50 W

Lat by Bar 9-45 S

Remarks Onboard Wednesday August 18th 1847

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes & squalls of
rain from N. W. S. steering South all prudent sail
set at 11 AM wind hauled close South by

Copper rich off duty
middle part strong breezes & rainy wind N. W. S.
took in the gallant sails & fly jib at midnight
latter part strong wind from N. W. all prudent sail
set the same by South at 2 PM set main & g. sail
