

Remarks Onboard Thursday August 19th 1847

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from S.W. accompanied with squalls of rain & fog all prudent sail set heading W.E. at dusk took in main top gallant sail single reef the top sail hoisted up to the mast

Middle part the same weather wind increases at 10 P.M. put another reef in the topsails

and a spool of black fish
 Latter part. Strong breezes from more southerly ship heading S.E. by South people employed drawing gear
 Copper very rich

Long per Chen 17=53 West Lat by Bar 7=0.9 North

Remarks Onboard Friday August 20th 1847-

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from S.W. all prudent sail set ship heading S.E. on wind people employed drawing & mending gear

Middle part the same weather on line more southerly ship heading S.E. on wind
 all sail set 2d day light

Ends with strong breezes from South at 10 P.M. took in ship heading W.W. clear weather people employed fitting main top sail & top gallant yard gear mending fly jib repaired it bent again
 copper rich Long=16=12 W Lat by Bar 6.15.2 W

Remarks Onboard Saturday August 21st 1847-

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from South ship heading W.W. on wind people employed at various jobs at dusk killed 2 pigs

Middle part the same ship head S.E. from 8 A.M. till night

Ends with strong breezes & squalls with rain at 10 P.M. saw 3 thermophodite birds & landing west bank to windward of us took in heading with us S.E. people employed at various jobs making & taking in sail as occasion required

Long 14=12 West

Lat North by Bar 6.27. W

Remarks Onboard Sunday August 22nd 1847

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from W with squalls of rain & wind ship heading W.E. at 5 A.M. at ship heading W.W. took in fore top gallant sail & fly jib & top sail

Middle part severe rain took in ship at 9. stood S.E. until 11 A.M. took in heading W by South strong breezes

Latter part pleasant with strong breezes passed one brig & several barkes heading S.E.

Copper getting better
 Long per Chen 16=30 Lat by Bar 5=38 W

Remarks Onboard Monday August 23rd 1847-

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from S.W. all sail set ship heading W.W. at 3 P.M. took in S.E. Sails & took in 2 English Barks at 4 took in heading W by South 3 sail in sight

Middle part squally with rain ship head W.W.

Copper on duty
 Latter part squally until 2 P.M. was clear wind S.W. all sail set ship heading W.W. on wind set up fore rigging

Long per Chen 17=40 West Lat by Bar 5=04 North

Remarks Onboard Tuesday August 24th 1847

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from S.W. clear weather all sail set head to W.W. until 4 A.M. about ship heading S.E. people employed at setting rigging & mending gear

Middle part winds more to W.W. put 3 ships head

Latter part the same broke out water filled but filled 7 casks with salt water for ballast

Long per Chen 17=22 West Lat by Bar 5=28 North
