 These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from N by W
 all sail set heading N. E. & E people employed at various
 jobs fitted new Bantam blocks for fore sail killed 2 pigs
 at 4 P.M. took ship heading N.W. pleasant
 Middle part the same

Letter five breezes from N by E all sail set heading
 N.W. by W one sail in sight to leeward
 employed making spangars

Long per Chron 17-45 West Lat by Obs 3-30 North

Remarks Onboard Thursday August 26th 1847
 These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from
 N by E passing clouds all sail set heading N.W. by W
 one brig in sight to leeward setting up main & top
 mast back stay & rigging made head chain &c.
 Middle part the same

Ends with moderate trades heading N.W. by W
 at 4 P.M. saw blackish cloud to N.W. barometer
 Long at 10 A.M. 20-30 W. Lat by Obs 1-48 N

Remarks Onboard Friday August 27th 1847
 These 24 hours begins with moderate trades from
 N by E passing clouds all sail set heading N.W. by W
 at 4 P.M. saw 2 finbacks
 Middle part the same

Letter part more moderate winds N by E all sail
 at one sail in sight employed leathering head stay
 lead & pig brought a barrel of beef

Long 21-10 W. Lat by Obs 00-00 North

Remarks Onboard Saturday August 28th 1847
 These 24 hours begins with fresh trades from N.E. & N
 passing clouds only heading N.W. all sail set one bark
 in sight to windward

Middle part the same took in fly jib & gaff top sail
 had 2 visits from Neptune

Letter part strong trades from N.E. to N by E with passing
 squalls employed setting mizen rigging picking out
 unions one sail in sight

Long per Chron 22-10 W. Lat by Obs 2-40 South

Remarks Onboard Sunday August 29th 1847
 These 24 hours begins with strong trades from N.E. by N
 all prudent sail set heading N.W. by N passing squalls
 of wind & rain at 4 P.M. sent down fore & main royal
 yards & masts unrove rigging

Middle part strong squalls with in apparent sails
 single reef fore top sail

Letter part made all sail ends pleasant saw
 nothing

Long per Chron 22-45 W. Lat by Obs 4-47 South

Remarks Onboard Monday August 30th 1847
 These 24 hours begins with fresh trades from N.E.
 & pleasant all sail set heading N.W. by W saw finbacks
 & one sail at dusk squally took in fly jib & gaff top sail
 Middle part squally

Letter part moderate & pleasant heading N.W. by W
 people employed on rigging
 & hoisting up quarter sail

Long 23-20 W. Lat by Obs 7-12 North
